From the Pastor's desk...

#### Renew Your Mind

Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God - this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is - his good, pleasing and perfect will. Romans 12:1-2

The Bible tells us that we need to renew our minds. Have you ever wondered why that is? It is because what we think is what we become. In the Old Testament, it says, "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he" (Prov. 23:7 NKJV). What we think about is what we are going to yearn for and what we will become. Rene Descartes famously wrote, "Cogito, ergo sum," or "I think, therefore I am." What we think about is also what we worry about; what we worry about is what we are afraid of, and that will become our idol. What do you think about? Do you think like a Christian (taking every thought captive to obey Christ), or do you think as the world thinks and just add a Christian tagline or motto to your thoughts?

When we renew our minds, we start to think in a Christian way. This changes the way we do things, It changes the way we parent, how we treat our spouse, how we talk and act in our workplace, and how we live our lives. It is not enough to just keep thinking the same way we used to think before, adding a few touch-ups and shining it all up. That will not make a difference. We need to renew our minds entirely.

It is so important for us to understand that the way we think affects our lives. It is the difference between living a life or worry and anxiety and living a life of freedom and peace. I want to encourage you to read the Scriptures and fill your mind with the Word of God. Worship and listen to preaching. Fill your mind with the things of God, so it will be renewed in a godly way, and then you will respond to things in a godly manner.

I realize this is easier said than done. But it has to be a fight we continually wage. So much is coming at us each day, so much to worry about. This is all the more reason to renew our minds. To seek an obtainable peace in Christ. He loves you and is in control. Let your mind rest and renew in Him.



2025 CHRISTMAS MUSICAL - DECEMBER 7, 6:00 p.m. This year's Christmas musical, "In a Galilee Far, Far Away," is set in the present time aboard a spaceship called the S. S. Emmanuel. (Think "Star Trek.") It is the world's most advanced spaceship; and when the play opens, the crew aboard the ship is orbiting into deep space. Their mission is to discover, witness, and record the indescribable beauty and size of God's creation. Since the ship can travel at or near light-speed, the crew plans to complete in just six months what would take a "normal" spaceship decades. Their mission motto is Psalm 19:1: "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands."

When the crew runs into some navigation difficulties, what was once a six-month mission has already lasted nine months. Christmas Eve is upon them, and they are looking for ways to celebrate despite being so far from home. Because everyone wants so badly to be home for Christmas, they decide to utilize the "hyper-active" lever on the spaceship supposedly to have them home within minutes. When things don't go as planned, the crew suddenly finds themselves involved in BACKWARDS time travel where they meet some interesting people from the past. It is then that the captain devises a plan to go all the way back to when Jesus was on Earth to celebrate Christmas in "a Galilee far, far away." We currently have 41 children and at least 12 adults signed up to participate. This is the largest number of children we have had in several years, and we are excited about their willingness to be involved. Parents of these children will begin receiving text messages this week FULL of information to help the children learn the songs on their own and choose solos and/or parts for which they would like to audition. In-person rehearsals will begin in late October. 
