Four more bodies of murdered Israelis were discovered in the vicinity of the ravaged kibbutz Be'eri, Israel's National Rescue Unit 360 announced on Wednesday evening.

These join the 130 previously recovered bodies of civilians murdered by Hamas in the kibbutz during the October 7 massacre.

The footage from the interrogation was released on Monday and showed selected clips from six separate interrogations.

Each terrorist had a slightly different experience, but Israeli intelligence forces noted a number of common themes. All the Hamas agents were given explicit instructions to kill and kidnap civilians including the elderly along with women and children. While they did this, their commanders stayed behind in Gaza.

#### The reward for terrorism

One of the terrorists told Israeli forces that "whoever brings a hostage back [to Gaza] gets \$10,000 and an apartment."

They said that the plan had been to take over the towns they attacked and hold positions there once they had finished killing and kidnapping the residents.

The video released by the Shin Bet and the police shows the various Hamas operatives going into extreme detail about their activities on the morning of October 7. "The instructions were to kidnap women and children," said one. Another described an encounter with a dead body, saying: "Her body was lying on the floor. I shot her, and my commander yelled at me for wasting bullets on a dead body."

They made it clear that when it came to murder, they were not to distinguish between civilians and soldiers.

"When we finished," another Hamas operative said, "we burned two houses." One described entering a house after his comrades had already shot a man living there. "Two [terrorists] went into the house ... we heard voices inside. Another two came in. There was one lying on the floor next to the door. I don't know if he was dead, but there was blood next to him. Inside there was one wounded man... I think a whole family. In their pajamas. The wounded man was in his underwear. A woman came out wearing a dress... then another with a dress. [Then] a boy and a girl."

He continued: "We went to the next house. From there, they took out a woman. An old woman."

He was then asked if these family members were used as human shields, and answered "Yes."

Another terrorist, who was at Be'eri, told interrogators: "When I entered the town, I saw two [terrorists] on a motorbike. They took a woman about 60-65 years old [with them] on the motorbike."

"To Gaza."

The footage cuts to a later part of the same terrorist's account. "After Suleiman and Karem killed that woman from the town... they took someone, a man about 40-45 years old... and took him."

"Took him where?"

"To Gaza."

The terrorists also describe a variety of other horrific activities including using smoke to force civilians out of their shelter and shooting several pets. Although the footage is heavily cut, many of their stories feature dead bodies lying on the ground and people crying and trying to run away.

At the end of the video, each of the Hamas agents was asked if what they did was permissible in Islam. They all answered the same way: "No. Islam does not permit the killing of women and children."



The Palestinian Authority will pay families of dead Hamas terrorists a combined total of around \$2.8 million, according to a report by the Palestinian Media Watch, a media watchdog group. In the current "pay-for-slay" system, called the "Martyrs' Fund" by the PA, terrorists receive monetary payments as a reward for acts of terror. The more damage an attack causes, the higher the terrorist or the terrorist's family is paid. The PMW reported that a terrorist's family would be rewarded NIS 6,000 (around \$1,500) and an NIS 1,400 (\$353) allowance monthly for life. Both come up to about NIS 7,400. The families that the terrorists married into will receive an even higher amount, the report claims. The authority will also pay \$17,590 to approximately 50 new Hamas prisoners this month, the report said. The \$2.8 million in question equals more than NIS 11 million. The PMW claims that the \$2.8 million payments is a low estimate because there will be more "martyrs" and prisoners from the Hamas terrorist organization.





# Senior Israeli correspondent describes scenes at Kibbutz Nir Oz following Hamas attack

Itai Anghel was smuggled into Kibbutz Nir Oz by residents who wanted him to document the horrors that took place there despite a complete closure by the IDF on the area. He spent two days filming what was once a peaceful agricultural community. "You see hell. It's like you visit a nightmare. You see houses completely burned. You see bodies completely burned, mutilated. I can express myself pretty good, but I cannot express the smell; it's something that sticks and stays with you. This is horrible. You see the handle of the safe room in every house. It's twisted. It's a sign of the people inside who tried to give a fight in order to not let the Hamas terrorists enter." He said the only thing that pulled him through was his camera and the job he came there to do. I thank God that I have the camera with me, you know, to hold it, to occupy myself with filming, to aim at something, because if I hadn't had anything, I would collapse, I would have a heart attack." Anghel ran from rockets that continue to be fired at communities in Israel. "When I was there, you had two alarms of rockets, and you have between 10 and 15 seconds to hide. You know, people still want to annihilate you even if you managed somehow to survive."

#### Associated Press won't let reporters call Hamas a terrorist organization

News organization says journalists should refer to its former officemates as 'militants'.

The Associated Press instructs reporters and organizations that rely on its style guide to avoid referring to Hamas as a terrorist organization, a Washington Free Beacon review of the organization's standards found.

The news outlet states in its "Israel-Hamas Topical Guide" that because "terrorism and terrorist have become politicized, and often are applied inconsistently ... the AP is not using the terms for specific actions or groups, other than in direct quotations." The guidance will affect how dozens of regional newspapers and national outlets like Politico report on the ongoing war in Gaza.

Hamas, an Islamist militant group dedicated to the annihilation of Israel and Jews around the world, is classified as a terrorist organization by dozens of countries, including the United States and the European Union. Hamas has undertaken hundreds of terrorist attacks against civilians since 1993, according to the Jewish Virtual Library.

Instead of referring to Hamas—which earlier this month killed hundreds of innocent civilians, including children in an unprompted attack on Israel—as a terrorist group, the outlet says journalists should call its members "militants."

"Terms such as Hamas fighters, attackers or combatants are also acceptable depending on the context," the Associated Press style guide states.

The Associated Press did not respond to a request for comment.

Bucking the "terrorist" label is one in a series of strange decisions by the Associated Press, which include once sharing office space in Gaza with Hamas. That office, which the AP used for 15 years, was destroyed by Israeli airstrikes in May 2021. The Israeli Defense Force stated the building contained Hamas operatives and weapons, as well as an office for Islamic Jihad, another terrorist organization based in Gaza.

"We are shocked and horrified that the Israeli military would target and destroy the building housing AP's bureau and other news organizations in Gaza," AP president and CEO Gary Pruitt said in a statement at the time.

But an Israeli Defense Force source said at the time that Associated Press reporters were aware who their neighbors were. And The Atlantic reported in 2014 that Associated Press staffers in the Gaza office could see terrorists stationed next to their building launch rockets into Israel. Despite their proximity, the Associated Press never reported the rocket launches, which endangered the group's staff and nearby civilians.

"Hamas fighters would burst into the AP's Gaza bureau and threaten the staff—and the AP wouldn't report it," according to The Atlantic. "Cameramen waiting outside Shifa Hospital in Gaza City would film the arrival of civilian casualties and then, at a signal from an official, turn off their cameras when wounded and dead fighters came in, helping Hamas maintain the illusion that only civilians were dying."

The Associated Press has long attempted to influence the coverage of outlets by policing language.

Shortly after President Joe Biden took office, the outlet released new guidance related to immigration.

Going forward, the Associated Press declared in March 2021, journalists should refrain from using the word "surge" to describe large amounts of illegal aliens entering the southern border. That decision, a pro-immigration activist revealed in a Washington Post op-ed, was the result of a pressure campaign from the left.

Following the looting and destruction in the wake of George Floyd's death during the summer of 2020, the Associated Press suggested outlets opt for "milder terms" like "unrest" when describing riots.

#### Israel halts UN staff visas as officials pan Guterres's 'truly insane' Hamas remarks

After UN chief says terrorist massacres 'didn't happen in vacuum,' Foreign Ministry says words 'tarnish both him and organization he heads', Edelstein says they fan antisemitism.

Israel stopped issuing visas to UN officials Wednesday, a day after UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres appeared to say Hamas's murderous October 7 assault on southern Israel was brought on by Israeli occupation.

The development came as Israeli officials continued to rail against the UN chief and demand his apology or resignation, with a senior lawmaker branding his words "truly insane" and adding that they were fanning the flames of antisemitism. The chairman of Jerusalem's Yad Vashem Holocaust museum accused Guterres of having "failed the test" of the refrain "Never again."

An Israeli official confirmed the new visa policy to The Times of Israel on condition of anonymity, after Israel's ambassador to the United Nations Gilad Erdan gave additional details in an interview with Army Radio. "Due to his remarks we will refuse to issue visas to UN representatives," Erdan said. "We have already refused a visa for Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs Martin Griffiths. The time has come to teach them a lesson."

During a UN Security Council meeting Tuesday on the Israel-Hamas war, Guterres said, "It is important to also recognize the attacks by Hamas did not happen in a vacuum.

"The Palestinian people have been subjected to 56 years of suffocating occupation. They have seen their land steadily devoured by settlements and plagued by violence; their economy stifled; their people displaced and their homes demolished. Their hopes for a political solution to their plight have been vanishing," Guterres said.

He later added that "the grievances of the Palestinian people cannot justify the appalling attacks by Hamas. And those appalling attacks cannot justify the collective punishment of the Palestinian people."

Israel's war with Hamas in Gaza began after the terror group sent thousands of gunmen over the border to ravage Israeli border communities. Terrorists killed some 1,400 people, the vast majority of them civilians, massacring them at their homes and at a music festival. They also kidnapped at least 224 people and took them into the Strip.

Israel evacuated all settlements and military forces from the Gaza Strip under the 2005 Disengagement. Since then it has faced years of rocket attacks from Hamas, which rules the Strip, and from other terror groups there, as well as multiple rounds of intense combat.

It has maintained a tight blockade of the territory since Hamas took control in 2007, as has Egypt, with Jerusalem saying it must do so to limit the terror group's ability to arm itself for attacks. In the West Bank, settlements have expanded under consecutive governments with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu repeatedly arguing the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority is not a partner for peace, having rejected several offers in the past,

Guterres's comments drew outrage in Israel, On Tuesday evening, Erdan called them "shocking" and demanded that the secretary general resign, Foreign Minister Eli Cohen canceled a meeting with Guterres, and Minister Benny Gantz labeled the UN chief a "terror apologist."

The Foreign Ministry tweeted that Guterres's remarks "provoke anger and astonishment and tarnish both him and the organization he heads," reflecting "a biased and distorted attitude towards Israel on the part of the UN and especially on the part of the Secretary-General himself."

"The UN Secretary-General must retract his words, engage in deep personal soul-searching and apologize for his statement, which distressed millions of Israells who are still experiencing the consequences of the murderous terrorist attack of October 7," the ministry added.



Likud MK Yull Edelstein, the chairman of the Knesset's Foreign Affair and Defense Committee, sent an English-language public letter addressed to Guterres expressing "a profound sense of shock" and saying it would have been "best had you said nothing at all."

"Mr. Secretary-General, you opened by saying that 'nothing can justify the deliberate killing, injuring and kidnapping of civilians.' However, you then [made] an about-face and added that the 'attacks by Hamas did not happen in a vacuum.' Statements of this kind legitimize murderers, rapiats, and terrorists around the world — rendering your condemnations null and void," Edelstein charged.

Edelstein tweeted a photo of the letter, adding in a Hebrew-language post that Guterres's remarks had been "truly insane" and that "against the backdrop of surging antisemitism around the world, his grave remarks are fueling a giant fire jof hate)."



Israeli leaders and US President foe Biden have noted that the October 7 atrocities were the single worst attack on Jews since the Holocaust.

Yad Vashem chairman Dani Dayan, who met with Guterres earlier this year at a Holocaust-related exhibit at the UN headquarters in New York, said the UN chief had "failed the test" regarding ensuring atrocities against Jews don't repeat.

"The slaughter of Jews by Hamas on October 7th was genocidal in its intents and immeasurably brutal in its form. Part of why it differs from the Holocaust is because Jews have today a state and an army. We are not defenseless and at the mercy of others," a statement from Dayan said.

"However, it puts to test the sincerity of world leaders, intellectuals and influencers that come to Yad Vashem and pledge 'Never Again,' be continued, "Those who seek to 'understand,' look for a justifying context, do not condemn the perpetrators, and do not call for the unconditional and immediate release of the abducted - fail the test.


"UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres failed the test."

In a shock assault on October 7, Haman bombarded Israel with thousands of rockets while over 2,500 gunmen breached the border with the Gaza Strip. The terrorists rampaged murderously through southern areas, slaughtering those they found, butchering entire families in some communities and also killing 260 at an outdoor music festival. Some victims were mutilated, raped and tortured. Dozens of babies were killed. Over 220 people of all ages were abducted and dragged to Gaza as captives. Four have since been released.

Israel has responded to the Hamas assault by vowing to destroy the terror group and launching intensive strikes in Gaza, saying it is hitting terror targets while trying to avoid civilian casualties. It has told over one million Gaza residents to evacuate the northern part of the Strip ahead of an expected ground incursion.

The Hamas-controlled Health Ministry says the strikes have killed over 6,000 Palestinians so far. Those numbers cannot be independently verified and are believed to include Hamas's own members, as well as civilians killed by hundreds of misfired Palestinian rockets.

# Released by Hamas, American mother, daughter reunited with family

GAZA/EVANSTON, Illinois, Oct 20 (Reuters) - Two newly freed American hostages, a Chicago-area woman and her teenage daughter, were reunited with family inside Israel on Friday as relatives celebrated back home in Illinois, nearly two weeks after Hamas gunmen abducted them and dozens of others near Gaza.

Judith Tai Raanan, 59, and her daughter Natalie, 17, were handed over to Israeli forces at the Gaza Strip border on Friday, becoming the first captives whose release by Hamas has been confirmed by both sides since the latest round of Arab-Israeli bloodshed erupted.

JERUSALEM – Hamas released two more hostages Monday, likely bringing relief to families who were desperate for their return but leaving hundreds of people in agony over the fate of the more than 200 people who remain captive.

The two hostages were identified as Nurit Cooper, 79, and Yocheved Lifshitz, 85. In a statement on Telegram, the military wing of Hamas said it had decided to release the two women for "compelling humanitarian" reasons.

The International Committee of the Red Cross said it had "facilitated" the release of the two captives and transported them out of Gaza on Monday night local time.

#### Why the tunnels under Gaza pose a major problem for Israel's potential ground invasion

The extensive system is a "nightmare for an assaulting force," one expert said.

As Israel warns of an imminent ground assault in Gaza, one challenge that awaits a potential ground invasion involves a widespread underground tunnel system designed to conceal and cover Hamas militants and execute surprise attacks, experts

Hamas has previously claimed to have built 500 kilometers -- more than 300 miles -of tunnels under Gaza. The tunnel system is so extensive and well-known it's referred to by some -- including the Israel Defense Forces -- as the "metro."

Israel has become adept at detecting so-called terror tunnels that have crossed its border -- though the extensive tunnel system in Gaza "will present serious challenges for the Israel Defense Forces," Bradley Bowman, the senior director of the Center on Military and Political Power at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies, told ABC News.

"The tunnels permit some Hamas fighters to survive bombardment, move around Gaza under cover and concealment, resupply its forces, hide hostages and conduct surprise attacks," Bowman said.

"Imagine going into an environment and then you're progressing across the field or into the outskirts of the city, then all of a sudden, some enemy forces pop up behind you and there were none there before," he said. "That's kind of a nightmare for an assaulting force."

Most of the tunnels are reinforced with concrete and some are quite deep, allowing them to protect Hamas militants against airstrikes, Bowman said. In 2020, Israel found one tunnel that went as deep as 230 feet below the surface, according to the Modern War Institute at West Point.

Some parts of the tunnel system are wired for electricity and communication, and many of the passages are wide enough to easily move significant quantities of equipment, ammunition and forces through, Bowman said. The average tunnel is about 6.5-feet high and a little more than a foot wide, according to a 2016 article in the journal Geopolitics.

The tunnels will be a key part of Hamas' "guerrilla warfare strategy," according to John Spencer, the chair of urban warfare studies at the Modern War Institute at West Point.

"Its fighters will form small hunter-killer teams that move underground, pop up, strike, and pop quickly back into a tunnel," Spencer wrote in a piece published Tuesday.

Hamas also uses the tunnels to hide and move rockets and rig "tunnel bombs under main roads and buildings that the IDF might be lured into," Spencer wrote.

The IDF has acknowledged the challenges posed by the tunnel system.

"It is not an easy endeavor because Hamas has embedded itself inside and underneath the Gaza Strip," Lt. Col. Jonathan Conricus told ABC News in the wake of Hamas' attack.

Conricus said the tunnels strategically run below civilian infrastructure throughout the Gaza Strip.

"That is how Hamas has been able to stop our weapons and hide countless rockets in all of these clashes that we've had," he said. "That is where they're hiding now as we're bombing, that is where their weapons are, and that is what they rely on, that's the military infrastructure that they rely on in order to keep on fighting."

The IDF has several units that specialize in combating the tunnels, including the Yahalom -- "one of the largest units in the world that trains, mans, equips, experiments, and develops new ways to deal with underground warfare," according to Spencer. In the wake of Hamas' surprise Oct. 7 attack, the IDF has claimed to have struck targets belonging to Hamas, including "a number of underground tunnels."

Economy Minister Nir Barakat told ABC News on Thursday, "The tunnels will be the world's biggest cemetery. We shall do all efforts to bring our hostages alive," but the "first and last priority" is destroying Hamas.

Israel will have technical advantages in a ground incursion, including drones, though that advantage will be reduced to some degree as it enters enemy territory, Bowman said.

"Once you're talking about block-to-block, building-to-building, room-to-room, in some cases, hand-to-hand fighting, it really gets pretty brutal pretty fast," Bowman said.

Mick Mulroy, a former deputy assistant secretary of defense for the Middle East and an ABC News contributor, said that for Israel to "clear buildings, basements and the extensive network of tunnels, they will have to dismount their infantry and essentially fight soldier-on-soldier and block-by-block."

Hamas -- which has "home-court advantage" -- has also likely prepared for a major Israeli ground incursion "long before Oct. 7," Bowman said.

"That's going to make any Israeli ground incursion more difficult because Hamas is probably prepared for this scenario," he said.

#### The Long History Of The Gaza Tunnels

Israel has agreed to delay the invasion of Gaza for now, so the US can rush missile defenses to the region, the Wall Street Journal reported on Wednesday, citing US and Israeli officials. US military officials were trying to convince Israel against carrying out a ground invasion of the Gaza Strip in response to Hamas's October 7 massacre, CNN reported on Wednesday citing "several sources familiar with the matter." As per the report, American officials advised the IDF against a counterinvasion, with the fear it could "endanger hostages, civilians, and further inflame tensions in the region." Instead, the IDF was urged to deploy a "combination" of precision airstrikes and targeted special operations raids" across the Strip. The United States has sent a significant amount of naval power to the Middle East in recent weeks, including two aircraft carriers, their support ships and about 2,000 Marines. Washington is on heightened alert for activity by Iran-backed groups as regional tensions soar during the Israel-Hamas war.



#### UN says fuel shortages will halt Gaza aid operations within a day

The main United Nations agency in Gaza says it will have to halt aid operations within a day if fuel is not delivered, in what the organization says would mark the end of a "lifeline" for civilians.

While some aid has reached Gaza through Egypt, those deliveries included food, water and medicine - but not fuel. Israel has refused to allow fuel to enter Gaza since Hamas' brutal October 7 attack, saying it would only be used by the militant group to fuel its fight against Israel. Asked how long the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) could last without fuel, spokesperson Tamara Alrifai told CNN: "We're probably talking a day." We have already warned that if fuel runs out by tonight or tomorrow, we as UNWRA, the largest UN agency in Gaza, will no longer be able to work." The organization initially said it would have to halt operations Wednesday evening. UN officials warned the current supplies were "a drop in the ocean" for the needs of 2 million Palestinians living in Gaza and will be of little use without the fuel needed to collect and distribute the aid. "Without fuel, aid cannot be delivered, hospitals will not have power, and drinking water cannot be purified or even pumped," UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres told the UN Security Council Tuesday. Doctors in overwhelmed hospitals on the brink of shutting down have repeatedly warned that waves of new patients injured in the daily bombings and babies relying on oxygen supplies will die if fuel is not brought in.

Relief efforts in Gaza will be forced to stop unless fuel supplies reach the besieged territory, the main UN agency working in the strip has warned.

Hospitals, bakeries and water pumps may also cease to function, compounding a humanitarian crisis that is worsening by the hour, the UN Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) said. "We need to find a solution to the fuel - otherwise our aid operation will come to a stop."

Oxfam accused Israel of using starvation as a weapon of war against Gaza civilians, saying the enclave was receiving just 2% of its usual supply of food. "The situation is nothing short of horrific - where is humanity?" said Sally Abi Khalil, Oxfam's Regional Middle East director.

Nearly 600,000 people displaced from their homes by Israeli bombardments are sheltering in 150 UNRWA facilities that are four times over their capacity, leaving people to sleep on the streets. Winding down relief would eliminate a "lifeline" for civilians, Juliette Touma, the agency's director of communications, told CNN.

# Gaza hospitals in crisis as Israel-Hamas conflict rages on

#### Hamas fires long-range rockets at Eilat, Haifa, as IDF strikes on Gaza continue

Israeli fighter jets continued to pound the Gaza Strip in the early hours of Wednesday, targeting Hamas command centers and other assets and killing a senior commander in the Palestinian terror group, as the terror group fired long-range rockets toward both Haifa and Eilat later in the day.

Hamas boasted that it launched a long-range rocket from the Gaza Strip at Israel's southernmost city of Eilat. The rocket did not set off sirens in Eilat or any other towns in the south, and the IDF later said that the projectile landed in an open area, causing no injuries or damage.

Earlier the terror group also claimed to fire a long-range R160 missile toward the Haifa area, setting off sirens in the northern towns of Daliyat al-Karmel and Kerem Maharal. The IDF said the projectile exploded in mid-air.

# AOC blames Christian fundamentalists for fueling Palestinian-Israeli conflict

(October 23, 2023 / JNS) While many have focused on radical, Islamic fundamentalism following Hamas's terrorist attacks on Israel on Oct. 7, Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-N.Y.) has decided to point fingers elsewhere: at Christian extremists.

"The country that is Israel today is not the Israel of the Bible," the politician, known as AOC, told the New York radio program "Hot 97/WQHT" last week.

"It's not just Islamic. It's not just Jewish. It is also Christian," the congresswoman said on Oct. 12 of the conflict. "In the United States of America, Christian fundamentalism and nationalism—which has also been extremely antisemitic—has also aligned itself with some of the most right-wing and authoritarian and inflammatory powers in the region."

A spokesman for Ocasio-Cortez told JNS that her schedule was "slammed" and declined to comment.

On Oct. 20, Ocasio-Cortez wrote: "Release the hostages. Protect the innocent. De-escalate. Ceasefire now." Similar words were used the day before as part of a protest in the Rotunda of the U.S. Capitol building, which led to the arrests of 300 far-left activists.

"What angers me about the GOP's attempts to turn the United States into a far-right Christian theocracy is how dishonest they are about it," she wrote in 2019. "At least be forthright about your desire to subvert and dismantle our democracy into a creepy theological order led by a mad king."



With tzitzit in high demand for IDF soldiers, volunteers take on the challenge

Jerusalem community prepares 60,000 pairs of the four-cornered, fringed ritual garments requested by religious

In an inconspicuous school hall in the heart of Jerusalem, dozens of people from all walks of life sit together at long tables preparing tzitzit — knotted fringes worn by religious Jews — to be sent out to IDF soldiers on the front lines of war. As a result of the mass mobilization, many reservists found themselves without the necessary equipment — both tactical and spiritual. One item in particular has been in high demand, with religious and secular Jews alike putting in requests for it: tzitzit. Faced with a request for 60,000 of the fourcornered fringed garments, the Military Rabbinate turned to Yeshivat Eretz Hemdah, which in turn mobilized its community to come together and prepare the tzitzit.



### Holocaust survivor escapes Hamas but fears for missing family

JERUSALEM, Oct 16 (Reuters) - Being unsafe in her own home was a feeling that 87-year-old Holocaust survivor Ruth Haran had not experienced since the end of World War Two.

That changed on Oct. 7 when Hamas gunmen burst into her home in the kibbutz of Beeri in southern Israel. They forced her into the house's safe room. She emerged hours later unscathed. Her family did not.

Ten of Haran's children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren are now missing, and she believes Palestinian militants are holding them in the Gaza Strip.
