What is Thankfulness?

Thankfulness to God is a recognition that God in His goodness and faithfulness has provided for us and cared for us, both physically and spiritually. It is a recognition that we are totally dependent upon Him; that all we are and have comes from God.

O Lord, surely I am Your servant, I am Your servant, the son of Your handmaid, You have loosed my bonds. To You I shall offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving [הוֹדָה todah], and call upon the name of the Lord. I shall pay my vows to the Lord, Oh may it be in the presence of all His people, in the courts of the Lord's house, in the midst of you, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord! Psalm 116:16-19

- Oh give thanks (יְדָה yadah) to the Lord, for He is good, for His lovingkindness is everlasting. Psalm 107:1
- Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving [εὐχαριστία eucharistia] let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7
- Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude [εὐχαριστία eucharistia].
 Colossians 2:6-7

- O give thanks (יְדָה yadah) to the Lord, for He is good; for His lovingkindness is everlasting. 1 Chronicles 16:34
- •Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body; and be thankful [εὐχαριστέω eucharisteo verb]. Colossians 3:15
- Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving [εὐχαριστία eucharistia noun]; Colossians 4:2
- Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving [תּוֹדָה todah noun], let us shout joyfully to Him with psalms. Psalm 95:2

- I will give thanks (יְדָה yadah verb) to the Lord with all my heart; I will tell of all Your wonders. I will be glad and exult in You; I will sing praise to Your name, O Most High. Psalm 9:1-2
- Let them give thanks [יְנָה yadah verb] to the Lord for His lovingkindness, and for His wonders to the sons of men! For He has satisfied the thirsty soul, and the hungry soul He has filled with what is good. Psalm 107:8-9
- To You, O God of my fathers, I give thanks [יָדָה yadah verb] and praise, for You have given me wisdom and power; even now You have made known to me what we requested of You, for You have made known to us the king's matter. Daniel 2:23

- Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving [הוְדָה todah noun] and pay your vows to the Most High Psalm 50:14
- We give thanks יְדָה yadah verb] to You, O God, we give thanks [יָדָה yadah verb], for Your name is near Psalm 75:1
- It is good to give thanks (יְדָה yadah verb) to the Lord and to sing praises to Your name, O Most High Psalm 92:1
- Be glad in the Lord, you righteous ones, and give thanks [יְדָה yadah verb] to His holy name. Psalm 97:12
- Let them give thanks [יְדָה yadah verb] to the Lord for His lovingkindness, and for His wonders to the sons of men! Psalm 107:21

- always giving thanks [εὐχαριστέω eucharisteo verb] for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father Ephesians 5:20
- Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks [εὐχαριστέω eucharisteo verb] through Him to God the Father.
 Colossians 3:17
- Thanks [χάρις charis noun] be to God for His indescribable gift! 2 Corinthians 9:15



- Through Him then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that give thanks
 [ὁμολογέω homologeo verb] to His name. Hebrews 13:15
- And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures; and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, 'Amen, blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving [εὐχαριστία *eucharistia* noun] and honor and power and might, be to our God forever and ever. Amen.' Revelation 7:11-12

THANKFULNESS should lead to action

Luke 17



While He [Jesus] was on the way to Jerusalem, He was passing between Samaria and Galilee. Luke 17:11





As He entered a village, ten leprous men who stood at a <u>distance</u> met Him; and they raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" Luke 17:12-13

"As for the leper who has the infection, his clothes shall be torn, and the hair of his head shall be uncovered, and he shall cover his mustache and cry, 'Unclean! Unclean!' He shall remain unclean all the days during which he has the infection; he is unclean. He shall live alone; his dwelling shall be outside the camp." Leviticus 13:45-46

When He saw them, He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they were going, they were cleansed. Luke 17:14

In our culture of platform building and rising celebrity status, we forget that God values the least. He places honor on the poor, the broken, the messy, and the marginalized. The 10 Lepers were outcasts of society. Beyond just having leprosy at least one was from Samaria which would have made him the lowest of the low. He had absolutely no status and was looked down on as an untouchable. Yet, Jesus treasured each one, even the Samaritan, heard their cries, and healed them. – Becky Harling

Be Intentionally THANKFUL

Luke 17:15-16

Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice, and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks [εὐχαριστέω eucharisteo verb] to Him. And he was a Samaritan.

Then Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine where are they? Was no one found who returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?" And He said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has made you well." Luke 17:17-19

Let's ask ourselves. Do we confessed Christians really thank God for what He has done? Do we really understand and value the significance of what He has done and is continually doing for us in our lives? Will we be like the Samaritan who glorifies God and falls down before Him for what He has done? Or will be like the other nine who simply go on and disappear after receiving what we ask God for? - JB Cachila

The Attitude of THANKFULNESS

Psalm 111



Praise the Lord! I will give thanks (יְדָה yadah verb) to the Lord with all my heart, in the company of the upright and in the assembly. Psalm 111:1

"Praise the Lord" = בַּלְלוּ־יָה Hallelujah
"Hallelujah" *is* found 24 times in the book of Psalms

In the Hebrew Bible "hallelujah" is actually a two-word phrase, not one word. The first part, hallelu, is the second-person imperative masculine plural form of the Hebrew verb hallal. However, "hallelujah" means more than simply "praise Yah", as the word hallel in Hebrew means a joyous praise in song, to boast in God. The second part, Yah, is a shortened form of YHWH, the name for the Creator. -Wikipedia

Great are the works of the Lord; they are studied by all who delight in them. Splendid and majestic is His work, and His righteousness endures forever. Psalm 111:2-3

- Have you remembered the works of God in your life?
- Have you thanked Him?
- Have you told others about His goodness?



He has made His wonders to be remembered; the Lord is gracious and compassionate. He has given food to those who fear Him; He will remember His covenant forever. He has made known to His people the power of His works, in giving them the heritage of the nations. Psalm 111:4-6

The works of His hands are truth and justice; all His precepts are sure (firm, unchangeable). They are upheld forever and ever; they are performed in truth and uprightness.

Thus the unmerited grace and passionate love which flowed out first in redemption, brought the Lord's people within the embrace of His covenant where they experience His providential care in daily needs, His power over all the power of their enemies, and His Word by which they live.
