## Friendships of Women Mary and Elizabeth

Both had unconventional pregnancies ... the kind that could bring on the gossip.

After we made some observations about their friendship, we focused on their sons ... particularly John the Baptist.

- 1. Have you ever asked God about the purpose of the child He might want to give you?
- 2. What if God wanted to give you a child for a unique purpose that doesn't fit the ideal mold you had in your mind?
- 3. What if God wanted to give you a child who would be used greatly by Him to help bring revival in this world?
- 4. What if God wanted to give you a child who would be made fun of for his faith?
- 5. What if God wanted to give you a child way past the world's standard of the "right number of children?"
- 6. Are you willing to teach and live out the truth no matter what?
- 7. Are you willing to be made fun of, even slandered for your faith?
- 8. Are you willing to suffer hardship for the gospel?
