6. Do your words help others remember who they are in Christ and who God is? (Think about your conversations this week. Did your words point others to Christ or to yourself?)

7. Are your conversations filled with encouragement and grace that build others up?

(Write one or two ways you could intentionally speak words of encouragement this week.)

8. How does receiving the reward of God's presence encourage you?

(Look up the following verses and use one or two of them in prayer to God:
