- 1. Personal Reflection

### Read Luke 14:12-14 (NLT).

Jesus challenges us to invite those who cannot repay us. How does this stretch your understanding of hospitality beyond simply being polite or social? Where might God be inviting you to extend hospitality to someone who cannot give back?

## Read 1 Peter 4:8-9 (NLT).

Peter urges believers to "cheerfully share your home with those who need a meal or a place to stay." Why do you think he connects love, forgiveness, and hospitality so closely together? How could cheerful hospitality itself be a witness to Christ?

# 4. Hospitality Across Differences

# Read Galatians 3:28 (NLT).

In Christ, the barriers of ethnicity, class, and gender are broken down. How does biblical hospitality push us to cross lines of generation, culture, or politics in practical ways? Share a time you saw this happen or experienced it yourself.
