

Sermon Series Discussion Guides

How To Use Discussion Guides:

1. Come to church (or listen to the sermon online when you miss a Sunday)

Each week's sermon is the foundation for your group discussion. By attending or listening online, you'll hear God's Word taught which will illuminate your discussion. This will align you with others around the same truth.

2. Find your group to gather and discuss with

Faith grows deeper in community. Joining a group gives you space to reflect on the message, ask honest questions, and hear how others are applying Scripture in real life. Together, you'll strengthen each other's walk with Jesus.

3. Leaders are important

Group leaders serve to guide discussion, keep conversations meaningful, and help foster a safe, welcoming environment. Lean into their leadership—they've been equipped and prayed over to serve you well in this journey.

4. Jot notes of what you're learning and the Holy Spirit's prompting

Don't let insights and spiritual truths slip away. Write down what God is teaching you and how He is nudging you. These notes will help you remember, apply truth, and grow meaningfully with your group.

5. Pray together & communicate in between meetings

Community doesn't stop when the meeting ends. Text each other, share prayer requests, check in, and celebrate answered prayers. Staying connected through the week builds the kind of relationships that truly transform lives.
