Many generously gave funds, offered places to stay, and invited our lead intern Clara out for a meal after her apartment complex caught on fire! Yes, busy with caring our church community has been.

Finally, as scam perpetrators fraudulently used email addresses similar to mine, your generosity showed. You thought I might need you to purchase gift cards to help someone or that I needed you to help me personally with a confidential conversation. Sure, I was livid about these criminals targeting such good people, AND I was touched by your goodness, your willingness to help, and your care. So once again, evil is overcome by love. May we remember: love prevails. May we remember: love prevails. I am still working with my anger and the police, and yet I hold fast to the goodness I see in you.

Lenten Dinner & Discussion Series Begins February 8

This year for Lenten programming, the Adult Ed Committee invites you to an 8-week program on Wednesday evenings in Fellowship Hall. Together we will read one chapter each week of "Forgive Us: Confessions of a Compromised Faith." This book presents historical and theological reflections on the sins that Christians have committed against the vulnerable and marginalized.

Each Wednesday evening will begin with dinner at 6 p.m. Discussion of the chapter will start at 7. We will close with an action item to be done together or at home, wrapping up no later than 8:30.

There are more chapters in the book than there are weeks in Lent. We will have two weeks of study sessions beginning February 8, meet for Ash Wednesday worship (Feb. 22), and then meet for five more weeks of study (Feb. 8 – Mar. 29).

We have a limited supply of 26 copies of the book available while supplies last; however, there is no limit to how many people can attend this Lenten Series. The first 26 people to submit payment may purchase the book from First Church for a fee of \$20, \$4 of which will support the weekly 6 p.m. dinner.

Please read the first chapter prior to our first meeting on February 8.



ECO Echo A Changing Jet Stream

If you were to stand outside on a clear day and look straight up into the sky, about seven to eight miles up, you might see a jet stream, if only it were visible. But a jet stream is made up currents of moving air—some hot, some cool—and the different temperatures make the air move from west to east, just like the Earth moves. There are about four jet streams in space above us between the poles and the equator. These jet streams determine the weather.

The sun heats some of this air above us, the North and South Poles cool some, and the ribbon of air we call the jet stream tries to rebalance the temperature by radiating the warm air back into space. But now, today, there is something blocking it.

Since the dawn of the Industrial Age, the burning of fossil fuels has added combustion gasses to the atmosphere all around the Earth. These greenhouse gasses act like a thermal blanket, so the jet stream(s) cannot radiate the heat back into the atmosphere high above us. So the Earth cannot cool down, and the jet streams are heating up! This added heat, what scientists call the greenhouse effect, intensifies weather events, causing severe droughts in some areas and raging rain and floods in others. We know what the problem is. We know how to solve it! We just need the WILL to do it.
