

GERMANY (TEENSTREET)

When: July 26 - August 6, 2023

Purpose: Join teens from around the world praising and worshipping the Lord through learning seminars, art, dance, and large and small group activities. Adults participate in the seminars and chaperone activities.

Cost: \$2100

Leader: Chris and Jody Shannon

About the Ministry: TeenStreet is an international Christian conference for teens. Their purpose is to work together with the church to inspire and equip Christian young people to have a real relationship with Jesus and to reflect Him daily in their world.

Q: Do I need a passport/visa?

A: You must have a valid passport through February 6 of 2024 (6 months after the trip). Getting a new passport can take up to 12 weeks so if you do not have one, begin that process as soon as possible. A visa is not required to enter Germany.

Q: Do I need any specific immunizations?

A: No

Q: What does trip preparation look like?

A: Prayer plus attending all required informational meetings and trainings (up to 4 total). Coaches of a small group should complete the supplied bible studies prior to leaving for TeenStreet.

Q: Where will we stay and what should I wear?

A: Volunteers (Service Team, Prayer Partners) stay in large tents with adults of the same gender; a nearby hotel stay is an option, for an additional cost. Coaches sleep in the mass housing with teens. Air mattresses are available to rent. Summers in Germany are like ours in Texas, so summer attire with a light jacket for evenings is recommended.

Q: What does a typical day look like?

A: Adults serving at TeenStreet help by walking closely beside the teens from our group to engage and draw close to Jesus throughout the week. Those who serve in different areas will have a scheduled shift that varies depending on their area of ministry. Coaches have the same schedule as the students:

6:30am-8am— wake up

8am— Breakfast

9:30am— Large Group worship and teaching

11am— Shhh Time

11:45am— Small Group

1pm— Lunch

2:15— Interaction Time (seminars, outreach, workshops, free time)

6— Dinner & Small Group Time

7:30—Throne Room (Worship)

9— Interaction Time (free time)

10:30– Small Group

11:30– Lights Out

Q: Do I need to speak German?

A: No! The large group gatherings, worship, and bible studies are all in English (translated to German on stage). Most students and adults who attend speak English as well.

Q. What does the trip cost include and when is it due?

A: Trip cost is \$2100 and includes airfare, lodging in the on-site mass accommodations, meals during the conference, and transportation. An additional \$250 for incidentals is recommended for meals during travel, sightseeing, souvenirs, etc. A deposit is due 3/31, with final payment due 6/20/23.
