It's incredible how sneaky and insidious sin can be in our lives, and we can combat that by, as one of my favorite characters from a book series says, "CONSTANT VIGILANCE!". This month, we're going to hone in on the book of 2 Peter and see what he has to say about keeping an eye out for any false teachings that might come your way and standing firm in your faith.

Peter talks a lot about how important it is to keep growing in what we know and assures us that God has already given us all we need to live a life that is pleasing to him. He encourages us to build up traits like self-control, perseverance, and love. Sounds familiar, doesn't it? Focusing on the gifts of the Spirit not only grows our faith but also allows us to live a life prepared and equipped to lead others to Christ. If we're not reading the scriptures and

connecting with the Holy Spirit daily, false prophets and teachers are hard to spot. Teachings that may be mostly true, just a little bit off, will divert us from God's will and his plan for us. That's why it's vital to stay connected to the truth, look things up yourself, talk with other believers about the Bible regularly, and keep your radar on for anything that doesn't quite add up.

Peter also gives us a reminder that Jesus will definitely come back, and we need to live in a way that shows we're ready for it, no matter when it happens. By being vigilant and keeping a clear mind, we can be all set for when God's promises come true.

I pray you reach a point in your journey with Christ where you and the Holy Spirit are so closely aligned that noticing anything that diverts you from Him becomes as effortless and instinctive as breathing. It takes work and dedication, and I know you can do it!

and ratify new board members.



When children are removed from their homes out of concern for their safety, they are usually brought to a child welfare services office to await placement. This wait can be a few hours to several days. These children often have nothing with them and are scared, lonely, hungry, and in dirty clothing.



The mission of Isaiah 117 House is threefold:

*Reduce trauma for children awaiting placement

*Lighten the load for child welfare services

*Ease the transition for foster families
