

Elder Qualifications

- 1. The qualifications of elders are found in 1Timothy 3:1-7 / Titus 1:5-9 / 1Peter 5:2&3.
- 2. Above reproach: he is one who demonstrates a lifestyle free from patterns of sin.
- 3. Husband of one wife: he is in a healthy marriage with one wife.
- 4. Temperate: is sober in judgment.
- 5. Prudent: is discreet, sound minded.
- 6. Respectable: is well-balanced, not abrasive.
- 7. Hospitable: loves people and will host strangers.
- 8. Able to teach: discerns and communicates sound doctrine.
- 9. Not a drunkard: does not drink in excess.
- 10. Not violent: he does not physically lash out.
- 11. Gentle: has a reasonable temperament.
- 12. Not contentious: is not quarrelsome, or disagreeable.
- 13. Not a lover of money: not greedy or irresponsible with money.
- 14. Manages his own household: well-ordered household and healthy family life.
- 15. Not a new convert: is not a new follower of Christ.
- 16. Has a good reputation with unbelievers: respected in the community at large.
