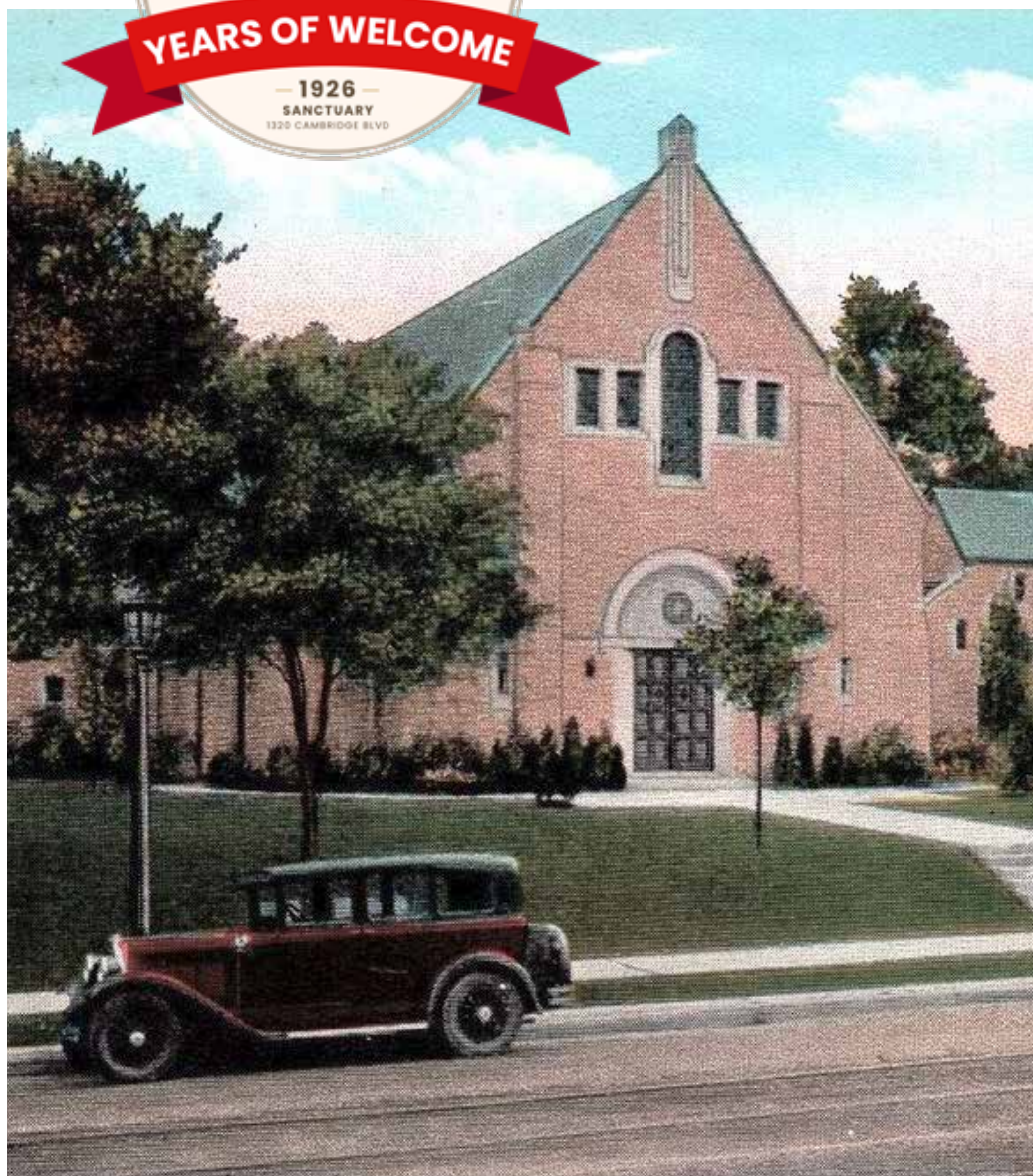

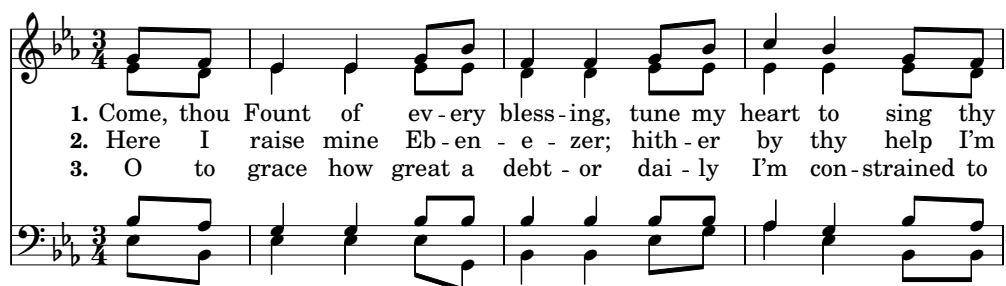

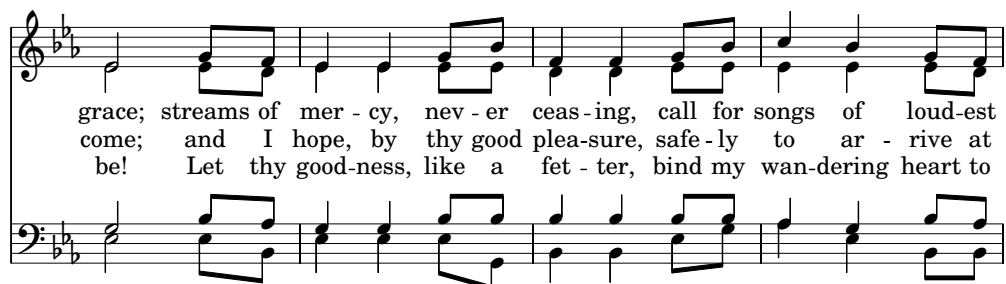
A reception, catered by Steven's Catering,

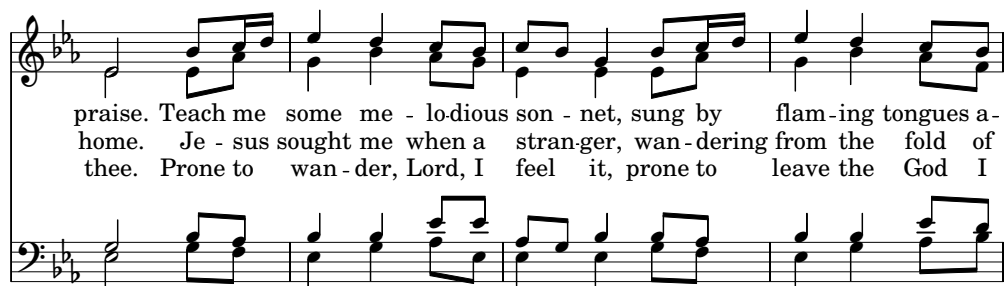

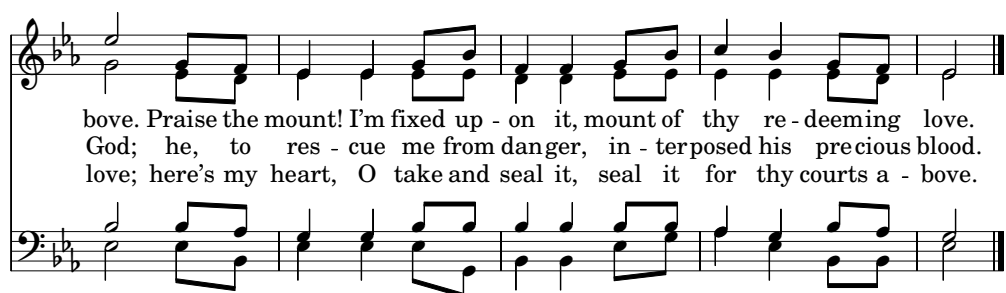
