7. Financial Report

- a. John Girard shared Finish Strong campaign totals to date
 - i. Total gifts/commitments received \$643,242. \$189,000 is from Foundation grants.
 - ii. Total payments on principal are \$285,000. Balance is \$1,847,000.
 - iii. Cashflow deficit is at \$460,000, down from original 627,000 in April.
- b. Mark Hollinger shared Financial Updates from the Forecast and Dashboard in the agenda packets.

8. Financial Leadership Team

- a. Mark Hollinger, chair, gave a report introducing the purpose and make-up of the committee.
- b. Team members include: Ginny Barney, Paul Anderson, Steve Mushrush, Scott Glaser, Mark Hollinger, Glen Miles, Liz Compton, John Girard.
- 9. Senior Minister Report Glen Miles
 - a. Highlights from William Bridges' book on change, transition, and moving forward: *Transitions: Making Sense of Life's Changes*.
 - *i*. We are in a season of change and transition at FC. Our work on reductng debt and eliminating cashflow deficit will point us toward "...the inner reorientation or self-redefinition that you have to go through in order to incorporate any of those changes" in the life of our congregation.
 - ii. Of special note is the anxiety and worry in the congregation that comes with a season like the one we are in now. It's important to recognize that change begins with an ending. Often this ending produces anxiety, shock, and chaos. For instance, our messaging about the South Assessment Team has been consistent and clear about the team's task, but some, in this season of anxiety, shock, or chaos have interpreted the team's work to mean the church is "closing South." Factually this was (and still is) untrue but the feelings expressed were true.
 - iii. The next phase in a time of transition is the neutral zone. Here feelings and emotions can be both/and. There is instability but also a genuine sense of curiosity.

- *iv*. The final phase, moving forward, usually brings about a sense of purpose, optimism, and clarity.
- b. Finish Strong update was reiterated. We are continuing to make asks, send letters, express our gratitude, and do all that needs to be done to complete this effort.
 - *i*. The Financial Leadership Team has begun their work and will meet again tomorrow, carefully reviewing every possible way to reduce spending while looking for any and all sources for increasing our revenues.
- c. Direction 2025 The FC South Assessment Team update
 - i. Tom Stewart, chair of the team, is leading with excellence. The team has completed a series of small group listening meetings, and are now in the process of designing two open houses where the team will provide many answers and responses to the questions that arose during the listening sessions.
- d. Summer Sermon Series: You Too: The Search for Something More
 - *i*. Using the music of U2 this series will explore the timeless themes of faith, grace, justice, unity, and hope.
 - *ii.* Relatedly, Kristy Glaser and Emily Rogers are designing a push to increase summer attendance.
- e. New Member Growth
 - i. We will welcome 16 new members in June, putting our total for the year at 63 to date. If we maintain this pace we will finish the year with 120 new members our highest since pre-covid.

 - c. Cashflow deficit is \$460,000. This is down from \$627,000 when campaign began.
- 4. The tent at FC North is provided by an Akita foundation grant, for Akita registrations and check-ins. The insurance for the tent is also paid for by the Akita foundation grant.
 - a. This tent is smaller than previous years and does not have the necessary side walls for video recording and streaming.
 - b. The tent is not large enough for outdoor worship seating this year.
 - c. By not worshipping under the tent we significantly reduce labor expenses of Facilities personnel and A/V Tech personnel by not setting up and tearing down chairs, microphones, speakers, monitors, and instruments every seek.
