DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

Pastor John said, "God is not a God of restriction but of liberty." Do you agree? Disagree?

Applying

What parts of engaging in creation seem to bring you most closely to spending time with God? What is it about those experiences that make them so engaging for you?

If Scripture truly is 'living and active' (as Hebrews 4:12 says), what are some ways we might engage with Scripture differently in our next week that can really allow it to be living and active in our lives?
