

‘PARTY-Time – We are far too easily pleased’

Adventure: Experiencing God in Recreation

John 2:1-11

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week’s sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

What do you think is the difference between worldly hedonism (pleasure-seeking) and the sort of pleasure seeking C.S. Lewis is encouraging in his quote that ended with the statement: We are far too easily pleased? (You might want to have someone look up the quote Pastor John shared in the sermon.)

When Jesus says ‘my hour has not yet come’ (v.4) what is he referring to? When is the point of time when his hour comes and what is it that comes at that point in time? (There might at least be a hint of what John, the author, thought about this in the conclusion of this narrative (v.11).)

Applying

Can you recall regret-free, full of joy party experiences? Where do you think God was in the midst of that?

Mary did not know what her son would do to address the pending embarrassment of running out of wine, but she did have complete confidence that whatever he would do would be consistent with his goodness and providence. In what ways can we learn from this and apply it?

Praying

In light of this message and discussion:

How can we pray for each other? Where do you feel challenged or convicted?

What can we praise God for? How can we pray for our church?



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
