

The Walk Of Becoming 'Love'

Galatians 5:13-25
DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

Have someone read 1 John 4:8. Being such a core aspect of God's nature, discuss why love is so predominant in God's self-revelation and what we receive from him. What does it mean that it is so central that if we do not love, John says we do not know God?

Have someone read 1 Corinthians chapter 13. Pastor Dary invited us to really consider these supposals (if we could understand and speak all languages, if we could understand all divine mysteries) in order for us to see that those are immensely valuable things. Discuss the significance of them being reduced to nothing without love.

Applying

What is the greatest measure of love you have experienced? What is the greatest measure of love you have extended?

Consider something challenging or concerning that you are facing right now. How might starting from a posture of love first, well before reacting and making sure your issues and concerns are communicated, change the way you approach that matter?

Praying
