ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS | MATT READ

Who teaches you and where do you go for wise council?

Growing up my Dad constantly encouraged me to be teachable, to be humbly willing to learn from others. With this core characteristic I have always sought out wise, discerning, godly mentors for every season of my ministry. This next season will be the same. Some of the mentors are authors whom I read regularly such as Chip Ingram, Norman Geisler and Dallas Willard. Currently, Pastor John is one of those mentors and even with him entering a new season of ministry I still consider him a mentor and will continue to seek his counsel. I also meet with a representative from the State Convention of Baptists in Ohio regularly. Pastor John introduced me to him as a man of integrity and prayer. He is someone I go to for wise counsel. Jersey Church also has a strong Church Council of wise and discerning men who I will regularly seek out for advice. I have multiple college friends who are either pastors or former pastors who are theologically conservative and have provided helpful perspectives. Finally, my fatherin-law, Sam Koon, regularly speaks into my life wisdom, discernment, and godly insight. Each of these relationships I lean on to learn and gather wisdom and discernment when I am working through challenges and decisions.

What is your vision for God's church at Jersey?

My vision for Jersey Church involves three things: Prayer, Calling, and Sending. First, that we would be a praying church. Prayer is the act of stopping to seek God. It can be seeking Him corporately or privately. When we pray, we humble ourselves and enter into direct conversations with Jesus Christ. In every aspect of our lives this is where we should start. If we seek the will of God, in prayer, as a church, He will do powerful things through us and in us. Second, is knowing and accepting our calling. God has not only called us into a saving relationship with Him, but He has called us to specific tasks for the furthering of His Kingdom. I envision Jersey being a church which helps people understand their calling and take steps of obedience into it. When every individual is taking steps into their calling, God will break through into the world and change people's lives. Third, is sending. After we have sought the Lord's will in prayer and for our individual calling, I see Jersey being a church which sends people out to begin movements for the Kingdom of God. The idea of sending people out can take a variety of forms, but all of them are focused around people taking steps of faith to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the World.

When we pray, answer the call on our lives, and send each other out to begin kingdom movements, we will see the Gospel of Jesus Christ spread across central Ohio, the United States of America and the World. When this occurs growth will happen. Growth will come from obedience to God. It is God who changes people's lives and when we obey in faith He will grow the church.

How critical do you feel personal evangelism is to the health of the church, and how do you model that discipline in your walk with Christ?

I feel evangelism is very critical to the health of the church. In Matthew 28 Jesus commands the twelve Disciples to "Go" and "baptize," meaning they were to go and proclaim the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all people. When the people accepted Christ as their Savior they were to be baptized. Those words of Jesus were not just a command to the twelve disciples, but to the church which is made up of all Christians. Individually, Christians should regularly be making an attempt to tell people about the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In my personal life I regularly cultivate relationships with unbelievers whom God has placed around me with the hope of telling them about Jesus. I have found relationships with unbelievers in my neighborhood, in my kids' school, parents of my kids' friends, guests at church, and coaches of my kids' sports teams. For the last five years my son's elementary school has invited me in to tell the Christian story of Christmas. Each time I clearly present the Gospel to 60 kindergarteners and their teachers. I have had numerous conversations with neighbors about Jesus as well. My wife and I work hard to invite people to church and include them in church events with the hope of them coming to know Jesus.

Do you agree with the BFM?

Yes. Please see the document regarding my thoughts on the BF&M.

What is your belief in the Biblical time frame to come. What happens to the nation of Israel during that time frame?

I agree with the BF&M Article X on Last Things. No one knows when, but Christ will return and judge the living and the dead. Those who believe in Jesus Christ will be saved at the second coming. I believe Israel always holds a special place in God's heart and Kingdom and I believe as we draw closer to the second coming of Christ there will be a revival within the Jewish nation.

What is your view of the structure of the church according to the Scripture?

Article VI in the BF&M states well the responsibilities and structure of the church. It includes the responsibility of each member within the autonomous local congregation, as well as the offices of pastor and deacon. I am in complete agreement with this article.

Do you believe one's salvation can be lost?

I do not believe a person can lose their salvation.

What do you see as the biggest challenge, in our Jersey Church, for a new pastor? How do you see yourself, obviously with God's help, overcoming or meeting that or any other challenges you foresee?

I believe the biggest challenge for the new pastor will be following Pastor John as Senior Pastor. Pastor John has served with faithful distinction for over 40 years. In any scenario it would be difficult to follow someone who has served for that long, but especially when the person has done it so well. I plan to work through this challenge through seeking the Lord through much prayer and Scripture, seeking wise counsel, and by living out who God has made me to be. I will use this same strategy to face all challenges I will encounter as Senior Pastor.

RESPONSES TO THE BAPTIST FAITH & MESSAGE | MATT READ

A note from Matt

According to Jersey Church's constitution: "It is the role of the Senior Pastor to support and protect the doctrinal integrity of the church. Our church constitution has assigned to the Senior Pastor to teach, preach, and interpret the Scripture as the Church's spiritual leader consistent with the Baptist Faith and Message (BF&M). I completely and whole heartedly affirm the Baptist Faith and Message. It was this statement of belief which strongly influenced my becoming a Southern Baptist Pastor. I appreciate its biblical basis and focus on the primarily doctrinal aspects of Christianity. It is well written and helpful for keeping a Christian, a church and a denomination aligned with God's Word. Below I will provide some thoughts under each section of the BF&M.

Baptist Faith & Message 2000

I. The Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. Therefore, all Scripture is totally true and trustworthy. It reveals the principles by which God judges us, and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. All Scripture is a testimony to Christ, who is Himself the focus of divine revelation.

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Scriptures.

Matt: I believe, in agreement with the BF&M, the Bible is God's Word and is divinely inspired without error. The Bible is not only my theological and doctrinal guide, but a guide for how I strive to live my life. I read, meditate upon, and memorize it as a daily practice in my life.

II. God

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. God is infinite in holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

I affirm the BF&M statement on God.

Matt: There is only one God. He reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Therefore, in life I owe my "highest love, reverence and obedience" to Him alone.

A. God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace. He is all powerful, all knowing, all loving, and all wise. God is Father in truth to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ. He is fatherly in His attitude toward all men.

I affirm the BF&M statement on God the Father.

Matt: God is my Heavenly Father because I am His son through faith in Jesus Christ.

B. God the Son

Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself human nature with its demands and necessities and identifying Himself completely with mankind yet without sin. He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His substitutionary death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, fully God, fully man, in whose Person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord.

I affirm the BF&M statement on God the Son.

Matt: Christ saved me at the age of 5 through the witness of my parents. I believe that Jesus Christ is fully man and fully God and now is my Lord.

C. God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. At the moment of regeneration He baptizes every believer into the Body of Christ. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the guarantee that God will bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

I affirm the BF&M statement on God the Holy Spirit.

Matt: I believe the Holy Spirit is fully God. As He gifts all believers for the tasks God has called them to, He has equipped me with the gifting necessary to serve as a Senior Pastor.

III. Man

Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation. In the beginning man was innocent of sin and was endowed by his Creator with freedom of choice. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Through the temptation of Satan man transgressed the command of God, and fell from his original innocence whereby his posterity inherit a nature and an environment inclined toward sin. Therefore, as soon as they are capable of moral action, they become transgressors and are under condemnation. Only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship and enable man to fulfill the creative purpose of God. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every person of every race possesses full dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Man.

Matt: I affirm that all humans are made in the image of God. Tragically, because of the Fall, every person is broken in sin and "only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship." I embrace the person God made me at birth. I strive to be a man of God and teach my sons to do the same.

IV. Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

A. Regeneration, or the new birth, is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new creatures in Christ Jesus. It is a change of heart wrought by the Holy Spirit through conviction of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace.

Repentance is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the entire personality to Him as Lord and Saviour.

B. Justification is God's gracious and full acquittal upon principles of His righteousness of all sinners who repent and believe in Christ. Justification brings the believer unto a relationship of peace and favor with God.

C. Sanctification is the experience, beginning in regeneration, by which the believer is set apart to God's purposes, and is enabled to progress toward moral and spiritual maturity through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in him. Growth in grace should continue throughout the regenerate person's life.

D. Glorification is the culmination of salvation and is the final blessed and abiding state of the redeemed.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Salvation.

Matt: I am a new creation in Christ by God's grace, not by works. I have repented of my sin and placed my faith in Jesus Christ. It is my daily ambition to grow more into the image of Christ, mature in the Lord, and to love His Church.

V. God's Purpose of Grace

Election is the gracious purpose of God, according to which He regenerates, justifies, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. It is consistent with the free agency of man, and comprehends all the means in connection with the end. It is the glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, and is infinitely wise, holy, and unchangeable. It excludes boasting and promotes humility. All true believers endure to the end. Those whom God has accepted in Christ, and sanctified by His Spirit, will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end. Believers may fall into sin through neglect and temptation, whereby they grieve the Spirit, impair their graces and comforts, and bring reproach on the cause of Christ and temporal judgments on themselves; yet they shall be kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

I affirm the BF&M statement on God's Purpose of Grace.

Matt: I am thankful for God choosing me. I am thankful God's grace will keep me until He returns or calls me home.

VI. The Church

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is an autonomous local congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws, exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. Each congregation operates under the Lordship of Christ through democratic processes. In such a congregation each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. Its two scriptural offices are that of pastor/elder/overseer and deacon. While both men and women are gifted for service in the church, the office of pastor/elder/overseer is limited to men as qualified by Scripture.

The New Testament speaks also of the church as the Body of Christ which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages, believers from every tribe, and tongue, and people, and nation.

**Note: This article was amended June 14, 2023, by action of the 2023 Southern Baptist Convention **

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Church.

Matt: I have been a part of a local church since I was a small child. One of my core convictions is that the Church is the Bride of Christ, the Body of believers and the central tool God uses to reach the lost and disciple believers.

VII. Baptism and the Lord's Supper

Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus. It is a testimony to his faith in the final resurrection of the dead. Being a church ordinance, it is prerequisite to the privileges of church membership and to the Lord's Supper.

The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

Matt: I was baptized by immersion at age 9. As a pastor it has been my joy to baptize people professing their faith on many occasions. The taking of the Lord's Supper is a beautiful worship experience to me because in it we proclaim the death, resurrection and return of Jesus Christ.

VIII. The Lord's Day

The first day of the week is the Lord's Day. It is a Christian institution for regular observance. It commemorates the resurrection of Christ from the dead and should include exercises of worship and spiritual devotion, both public and private. Activities on the Lord's Day should be commensurate with the Christian's conscience under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Lord's Day.

Matt: I find great joy in setting aside time in my life to regularly worship God with my brothers and sisters in Christ.

IX. The Kingdom

The Kingdom of God includes both His general sovereignty over the universe and His particular kingship over men who willfully acknowledge Him as King. Particularly the Kingdom is the realm of salvation into which men enter by trustful, childlike commitment to Jesus Christ. Christians ought to pray and to labor that the Kingdom may come and God's will be done on earth. The full consummation of the Kingdom awaits the return of Jesus Christ and the end of this age.

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Kingdom.

Matt: It is my desire to see God's Kingdom come in glory here on earth as it is in heaven.

X. Last Things

God, in His own time and in His own way, will bring the world to its appropriate end. According to His promise, Jesus Christ will return personally and visibly in glory to the earth; the dead will be raised; and Christ will judge all men in righteousness. The unrighteous will be consigned to Hell, the place of everlasting punishment. The righteous in their resurrected and glorified bodies will receive their reward and will dwell forever in Heaven with the Lord.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Last Things.

Matt: I believe Jesus is coming again, "in His own time, in His own way..." He "will bring the world to its appropriate end."

XI. Evangelism and Missions

It is the duty and privilege of every follower of Christ and of every church of the Lord Jesus Christ to endeavor to make disciples of all nations. The new birth of man's spirit by God's Holy Spirit means the birth of love for others. Missionary effort on the part of all rests thus upon a spiritual necessity of the regenerate life, and is expressly and repeatedly commanded in the teachings of Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ has commanded the preaching of the gospel to all nations. It is the duty of every child of God to seek constantly to win the lost to Christ by verbal witness undergirded by a Christian lifestyle, and by other methods in harmony with the gospel of Christ.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Evangelism and Missions.

Matt: It is my desire to make Christ known to those God has placed in my everyday life, as well as those unknown to me around the world.

XII. Education

Christianity is the faith of enlightenment and intelligence. In Jesus Christ abide all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. All sound learning is, therefore, a part of our Christian heritage. The new birth opens all human faculties and creates a thirst for knowledge. Moreover, the cause of education in the Kingdom of Christ is co-ordinate with the causes of missions and general benevolence, and should receive along with these the liberal support of the churches. An adequate system of Christian education is necessary to a complete spiritual program for Christ's people.

In Christian education there should be a proper balance between academic freedom and academic responsibility. Freedom in any orderly relationship of human life is always limited and never absolute. The freedom of a teacher in a Christian school, college, or seminary is limited by the pre-eminence of Jesus Christ, by the authoritative nature of the Scriptures, and by the distinct purpose for which the school exists.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Education.

Matt: I affirm the need for regular Christian community within a Grow Group for the purpose of spiritual growth in truth, be it intellectual, spiritual, or emotional. I affirm the need for the local church to have Spirit guided programs for its members of all ages for the purpose of growth in knowledge of the truth. I affirm the role of parents to educate their children as their conscience leads.

XIII. Stewardship

God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual; all that we have and are we owe to Him. Christians have a spiritual debtorship to the whole world, a holy trusteeship in the gospel, and a binding stewardship in their possessions. They are therefore under obligation to serve Him with their time, talents, and material possessions; and should recognize all these as entrusted to them to use for the glory of God and for helping others. According to the Scriptures, Christians should contribute of their means cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionately, and liberally for the advancement of the Redeemer's cause on earth.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Stewardship.

Matt: My wife and I recognize that all our resources (our time, treasures, and talent), are a gift of God to steward for His purposes. We firmly hold to generously giving beyond the tithe.

XIV. Cooperation

Christ's people should, as occasion requires, organize such associations and conventions as may best secure cooperation for the great objects of the Kingdom of God. Such organizations have no authority over one another or over the churches. They are voluntary and advisory bodies designed to elicit, combine, and direct the energies of our people in the most effective manner. Members of New Testament churches should cooperate with one another in carrying forward

the missionary, educational, and benevolent ministries for the extension of Christ's Kingdom. Christian unity in the New Testament sense is spiritual harmony and voluntary cooperation for common ends by various groups of Christ's people. Cooperation is desirable between the various Christian denominations, when the end to be attained is itself justified, and when such cooperation involves no violation of conscience or compromise of loyalty to Christ and His Word as revealed in the New Testament.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Cooperation.

Matt: I have come to understand the value of the Cooperative Program of the Southern Baptist Convention. By pooling our resources, we participate in reaching the world for Christ. Additionally, I deeply desire to work with other gospel-based ministries who share our core convictions.

XV. The Christian and the Social Order

All Christians are under obligation to seek to make the will of Christ supreme in our own lives and in human society. Means and methods used for the improvement of society and the establishment of righteousness among men can be truly and permanently helpful only when they are rooted in the regeneration of the individual by the saving grace of God in Jesus Christ. In the spirit of Christ, Christians should oppose racism, every form of greed, selfishness, and vice, and all forms of sexual immorality, including adultery, homosexuality, and pornography. We should work to provide for the orphaned, the needy, the abused, the aged, the helpless, and the sick. We should speak on behalf of the unborn and contend for the sanctity of all human life from conception to natural death. Every Christian should seek to bring industry, government, and society as a whole under the sway of the principles of righteousness, truth, and brotherly love. In order to promote these ends Christians should be ready to work with all men of good will in any good cause, always being careful to act in the spirit of love without compromising their loyalty to Christ and His truth.

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Christian and Social Order.

Matt: I dream of a day when my sons and our church can live in a world where there is justice, without racism, greed, or selfishness. A world where the poor receive care, the hungry are fed, and the unborn are protected. Since we live in a fallen world, this will be a lifetime ambition. I fully support the biblical teaching on marriage as being between one man and one woman. I do not believe any person's gender is fluid. I affirm and embrace my maleness as a gift of God because it is His blessing and He assigned it at birth. Regarding sexual behaviors, I believe sexual acts are to be within the confines of a biblical marriage and sexual acts outside of that covenant relationship are defined as sexual immorality, which is sin. My goal as a citizen is to be a voice of truth pointing society towards the love, righteousness, and truth of Jesus Christ.

XVI. Peace and War

It is the duty of Christians to seek peace with all men on principles of righteousness. In accordance with the spirit and teachings of Christ they should do all in their power to put an end to war.

The true remedy for the war spirit is the gospel of our Lord. The supreme need of the world is the acceptance of His teachings in all the affairs of men and nations, and the practical application of His law of love. Christian people throughout the world should pray for the reign of the Prince of Peace.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Peace and War.

Matt: We should seek peace. The hope for universal peace is the reign of Jesus Christ. I believe it is the duty of each believer to strive for peace, understanding the only solution is the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

XVII. Religious Liberty

God alone is Lord of the conscience, and He has left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men which are contrary to His Word or not contained in it. Church and state should be separate. The state owes to every church protection and full freedom in the pursuit of its spiritual ends. In providing for such freedom no ecclesiastical group or denomination should be favored by the state more than others. Civil government being ordained of God, it is the duty of Christians to render loyal obedience thereto in all things not contrary to the revealed will of God. The church should not resort to the civil power to carry on its work. The gospel of Christ contemplates spiritual means alone for the pursuit of its ends. The state has no right to impose penalties for religious opinions of any kind. The state has no right to impose taxes for the support of any form of religion. A free church in a free state is the Christian ideal, and this implies the right of free and unhindered access to God on the part of all men, and the right to form and propagate opinions in the sphere of religion without interference by the civil power.

I affirm the BF&M statement on Religious Freedom.

Matt: I thank God for the freedom in our nation to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I pray these freedoms are never censored or revoked by our government.

XVIII. The Family

God has ordained the family as the foundational institution of human society. It is composed of persons related to one another by marriage, blood, or adoption.

Marriage is the uniting of one man and one woman in covenant commitment for a lifetime. It is God's unique gift to reveal the union between Christ and His church and to provide for the man

and the woman in marriage the framework for intimate companionship, the channel of sexual expression according to biblical standards, and the means for procreation of the human race. The husband and wife are of equal worth before God, since both are created in God's image. The marriage relationship models the way God relates to His people. A husband is to love his wife as Christ loved the church. He has the God-given responsibility to provide for, to protect, and to lead his family. A wife is to submit herself graciously to the servant leadership of her husband even as the church willingly submits to the headship of Christ. She, being in the image of God as is her husband and thus equal to him, has the God-given responsibility to respect her husband and to serve as his helper in managing the household and nurturing the next generation.

Children, from the moment of conception, are a blessing and heritage from the Lord. Parents are to demonstrate to their children God's pattern for marriage. Parents are to teach their children spiritual and moral values and to lead them, through consistent lifestyle example and loving discipline, to make choices based on biblical truth. Children are to honor and obey their parents.

I affirm the BF&M statement on The Family.

Matt: Mary and I entered into a covenant marriage relationship on August 9, 2008 and we are resolute to keep that commitment until death do us part. It is my firm conviction that every child is a blessing, and that life begins at the moment of conception.
