



EfM is a Christian formation program from The School of Theology |The University of the South | Sewanee, where EfM lives. EfM is designed for lay people and part of deacon formation in many dioceses.

EfM believes:

- Christians are called to ‘ministry’ at baptism
- Spiritual growth and transformation require attention, intention, and practice
- Worship, prayer, study, and theology are core practices across faiths.

Therefore, EfM offers theological education and practices, context, conversation, and community for:

- Exploring faith matters and big meaning-making questions of faith and life
- Finding one’s own ways of being and doing in response baptismal promises and God’s call
- Engaging, responding, and reflecting
- Pathfinding, formation, sustaining, and transformation.

EfM happens in seminar groups of 6-12 guided by 1-2 mentors trained and accredited by Sewanee.

Through EfM we:

- Develop a common language to talk about transcendent things;
- Seek to identify and understand the sources of our own faith beliefs and gain insights, such as ‘Why do I believe what I believe and act as I do?’
- Pray to discover things like ‘Where do my faith and beliefs align with my choices, words and actions; and where do they diverge?’
- Explore and discern ‘How do I live according to my faith and beliefs?’ and plan next steps.

This is the ministry for which EfM (Education for Ministry) seeks to equip people.
