- **Block Time: when you go small enough, into the quantum world, it's as if time ceases to exist – past, present, and future coexist simultaneously.**
- **Quantum Entanglement: Two particles influence one another instantly, regardless of distance or time.**
- **Quantum Superposition: particles exist in multiple states.**
- **Quantum Event: when a quantum system goes from many possible states to one definite state. It's the “moment of decision” in the quantum world — whether that's a photon hitting a detector, an atom decaying, or an electron spin being measured.**
- **When we “look to the cross” in faith, its eternal power collapses into our moment.**

The Story illustration to understand quantum physics:

- Imagine you wrote two endings to the same story — one sad, one happy.
- Both endings exist at the same time in your notebook.
- Which ending becomes “real” depends on a quantum event.
