

The music department is looking for singers and instrumentalists to offer their gifts of music during worship. Youth of all ages are welcome to come up to the organ console after service to look at the organ console. Youth who are taking piano lessons are encouraged to bring a piece so they can try it on the organ. No experience necessary—all are welcome.

Joseph Jongen (1873-1953) was a Belgian organist and composer. His monumental *Symphonie Concertante* of 1926 is widely considered to be among the greatest works written for organ and orchestra. Dietrich Buxtehude (c. 1637-1707) was a Danish organist and composer of the Baroque period, who greatly influenced many organists and composers of the time, as well as J.S. Bach. In 1705, the twenty year old Bach took three months off from his church position to walk 250 miles to Lübeck to visit Buxtehude at the Marienkirche, overstaying his leave from his church position (and suffering the displeasure of his church council for being off for so long). John Rutter (b. 1945) is an English composer known primarily for his choral music; he founded and conducts his own choir, the Cambridge Singers.
