Worship/Music Notes

Gordon Young (1919 – 1998) was an American organist and composer of both organ and choral works; he spent many years as an organist/choirmaster in the Detroit area and is interred at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church. The organ music today features two French composers: Charles-Marie-Jean-Albert Widor (1844 – 1937), a French organist, composer and teacher of the mid-Romantic era, who is most notable for his ten organ symphonies, and Nicolas de Grigny (1672 – 1703) a French organist and composer who died young and left behind a single collection of organ music.
