The Bible is filled with stories of the faithful who are called by the Lord, say, "Here I am Lord. Send me." And then there is Jonah, the defiant prophet. When God calls, Jonah turns tail, and sails away.

This short book takes 10 minutes to read. Take a few minutes and read it before worship on Sunday.

The book of Jonah is filled with humor.

the unbelieving sailors who act like believers.

The evil Ninevites who, are more faithful than the faithful.

The King who issues a decree that all the kingdom must put on the sackcloth and ashes of repentance, even the animals! Animal and all show signs of being sorry for their misbehavior.

The big fish who should terrify and devour, but who ends up being an agent of God's salvation.

And the biggest joke of all is the prophet Jonah, stuck in resentment of his call. Jonah loved his wrath more than loving God's love. He fumes as he sits under his withered plant. It is such irony -- a worm is stronger than Jonah's faith.

You can read the book of Jonah as satire, irony, derision, wit, and humor but it is all for a serious purpose. It assumes God calls the faithful, but it is a drama. How will the faithful respond? Faith can turn the world around, but do the faithful want the new world God envisions? In all its humor, the book of Jonah asks, how willing are we to answer God's call and bring God's vision of a new world into being? Join us as we journey with Jonah, the reluctant prophet.

Pepper Choplin is a full-time composer, conductor and humorist. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of North Carolina and a Master of Music degree in composition from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. Choplin incorporates varied styles into his compositions, such as folk, Gospel, classical, and jazz.

The text for the offertory anthem was written by the American poet Frances Whitmarsh Wile, (1878—1939). Her lovely hymn to be sung in winter, "All beautiful the march of days" was written about 1907 while she was a parishioner of Rev. William C. Gannett, in Rochester, N.Y., in consultation with him, and was included in Gannett and Hosmer's revised edition of *Unity Hymns and Chorals*, 1911, and then into *The New Hymn and Tune Book*, 1914, and *Hymns of the Spirit*, 1937. Austin Lovelace arranged the tune, named forest green, and found in our hymnal set to a different text (see Hymn 712). Austin C. Lovelace (1919-2010) was called by many the Dean of American Church music. He worked at a number of Methodist and Presbyterian churches in Colorado, North Carolina, Illinois, and Nebraska. He also worked at Union Theological Seminary in N.Y.C. and Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill.
