Message from Dr. McDonald

In the last few weeks, we have been looking at the sense of call. This week, we conclude our mini-series with a look at 1 Corinthians 12 and 13. We are called by God to be together. Not just to passively "be," which can bring up images of being a couch potato, or being a passenger just along for the ride. The call as vocation is about actively responding to God's call in a life of fulfillment and

deep meaning. In the bible, the Christian call is deeply connected with being-together-incommunity.

If one were to sum up what it means to be a Presbyterian, you would find it in 1 Corinthians 12 and 13. We are called to being – to the fulfillment of life – by being together and acting together as the body of Christ. Paul writes how ridiculous it is to think we can do it all by ourselves alone. Or to think that we can live faithfully alone. As if all the body needed was a nose. Or an ear. Each part of the body plays a part, and only as all come together does the body experience the fullness of life.

So it is in the church. We need each other. Every member plays a part. Every part matters. If one suffers, we all suffer, because we are one body. If one is honored, we all are honored, because we are one body.

One of the most moving rituals of the church is the ritual of ordination. The laying of hands upon the new elders and deacons goes back to the time of Jesus and the Apostles. It is an image of how we are all connected together, connected to Christ, and connected to Christians throughout history and throughout the globe. When we can see that truth, it is a breath-taking moment.

It is a time of renewal for the body at the Kirk, as we recognize the call of God in appointing new trustees, elders and deacons. This act of the body of Christ signifies the health, vitality and strength of the whole body, as we move into the future.

I look forward to sharing this powerful ritual event with the whole body of Christ this morning.

Richard Proulx (b. 1937, St. Paul, Minnesota — d. 2010, Chicago, Illinois) was an American composer and editor of church music, including anthems, service music, hymn concertatos and organ music. The pronunciation of his name rhymes with the word new. He served as a consultant on several important hymnals, including The Hymnal 1982 of the Episcopal Church, the United Methodist Hymnal and the Roman Catholic hymnals Worship II (1975) and Worship III (1986).

Dale Wood (1934-2003) was a renowned American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions. When he was 13 years old, he won a national hymn-writing contest for the American Lutheran Church. He served as contributing editor to the Journal of Church Music, music director at the Grace Cathedral School for Boys in San Francisco, editor for The Sacred Music Press and chair of the publication committee of the Choristers Guild.

Aaron Shows (b. 1989) is an organist and composer originally from Montgomery, Alabama. He serves as the organist at the First United Methodist Church in Pasadena, CA. He earned a BFA in Church Music from Shenandoah University and his MFA in Film Music Composition from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts.
