

Derek Lockhart, trumpet

Derek Lockhart enjoys a diverse musical career as a chamber musician, orchestral performer, commercial artist and educator. He has performed in concert with the world-renowned Empire Brass since 2009 and became a member of the celebrated ensemble in 2013. A founding member of the Motor City Brass Quintet, he can also be heard performing with the Detroit Opera, the Detroit Chamber Winds and Strings and the Colorado and Sunflower Music Festival Orchestras.

Susan Clark Joul, cello

Susan Clark Joul is a freelance musician and has lived in Michigan almost all of her life, having grown up in Ann Arbor and returning to Michigan after graduating from Arizona State University. She is the manager of the Rochester Symphony Orchestra where she is also principal cellist for the group. Her string quartets play for many community events and weddings in the area.

Susan is a pianist and has accompanied violinist, Zeljko Milicevic for 14 years. The duo performs all around the area for recitals and other programs. For the last 16 years, Susan served as a soprano soloist for St Paul's United Methodist Church in Rochester, Michigan. She has a studio of 23 students in cello and piano.

Stephanie Shapiro, oboe

Stephanie Shapiro held the tenured position of Oboe/English Horn with the San Antonio Symphony from 1997-2011, where she was hailed by the San Antonio Express News for her "gorgeous phrasing and rich tone" and her "eloquent and exquisitely contoured" playing. Ms. Shapiro received her musical training at the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, where she earned her B.M., and went on to receive her M.M. at the University of Michigan while on a full fellowship. She has performed as a guest with numerous orchestras, including the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, Fort Wayne Philharmonic, Michigan Opera Theatre, Oregon Symphony and the Toledo Symphony Orchestra, among others. She currently teaches at Wayne State University, and maintains an active musical life as a soloist, orchestral musician, and chamber music collaborator and enjoys gardening and cooking in her spare time.

The Prayer for Illumination sung today is based on an Arabic tune found in the *Book of Spiritual Hymns for Evangelical Churches*, published in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1965. The source of the tune is unknown. Marilyn Biery set the tune to a traditional Prayer for Illumination found in the *Book of Common Worship* published by the Presbyterian Church USA (1993).

J.S. Bach's *Mass in B Minor* was composed in 1748/1749, and completed the year before his death. It was unusual for a Lutheran composer to set the entire Ordinary of the Mass; normally only the Kyrie and Gloria were set, but here Bach has included all the movements: Kyrie and Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, Osanna, Benedictus, Agnus Dei and Dona Nobis Pacem. The "Et in Spiritum Sanctum" is a bass solo found in the Credo section of the *Mass*.
