Advent 2025: The Gifts We Seek: Peace

Welcome to the second Sunday of Advent, the Sunday of Peace. We might have arrived carrying December's full mixture of joy, stress, longing, and anticipation; we might have arrived carrying questions of the heart—questions about meaning, stability, and the possibility of real peace in a restless world. Into all of this, the angels declare, "Glory to God... and on earth peace" (Luke 2:14).

But this is not the world's fragile peace—the momentary quiet we grasp at. It is a peace rooted not in circumstance but in the presence of Christ Himself. Jesus promises, "Peace I leave with you… not as the world gives" (John 14:27).

The shepherds heard the angels' song while still in their ordinary fields. God meets us where we are—in our work, our homes, our anxieties, our dreams. In a season that can easily fill with noise, Advent invites us to listen for the stillness of the holy. In a world marked by conflict, Advent invites us to glimpse God's reconciling promise. In the fullness of family life, Advent invites us to reclaim moments of sabbath.







About the music: The prelude is based on the German hymn tune: "Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme" (traditionally translated as: "Wake, Wake, for Night Is Flying," or "Sleeper's Wake! a Voice Astounds Us," found at #349 in the hymnal). The hymn is based on the parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids (Matthew 25: 1-13). This is one of the most well-known of Bach's organ works and is a transcription of a movement from Bach's cantata, BWV 140, of the same name.

Gustav Theodore Holst (Gustavus Theodore von Holst 1874 – 1934) was an English composer, arranger and teacher. Best known for his orchestral suite The Planets, he composed many other works across a range of genres, including music for the church. His distinctive compositional style was the product of many influences, Richard Wagner and Richard Strauss being most crucial early in his development. The subsequent inspiration of the English folksong revival of the early 20th century, and the example of such rising modern composers as Maurice Ravel, led Holst to develop and refine his style. The anthem sung today is one of his most well-known pieces of church music.

Richard Proulx (1937, St. Paul, Minnesota - 2010, Chicago, Illinois) was an American composer and editor of church music, including anthems, service music, hymn concertatos, organ music and music for handbell choir. The pronunciation of his name is suggested by the section of his catalog entitled "Noulx [new] from Proulx."
