A Note from Rev. Dr. Philip J. Reed

"After Christmas"

What a Christmas it has been at Kirk in the Hills! We gathered in familiar and new ways, singing carols, lighting candles, and hearing again the ancient story that continues to shape us. Our sanctuary was filled with music, beauty, and a deep sense of shared joy. It has been a season of connection, generosity, and worship that many of us will carry with us for a long time.

Now, Christmas gives way to the days after. The decorations come down, the music softens, and life begins to return to its usual rhythms. The world seems eager to move on.

The good news of Christmas, however, does not.

Scripture lingers with what comes next, leading us from the manger into a world that is still uncertain, still fragile, and still deeply loved by God. Matthew's telling of the Christmas story reminds us that God's work does not end with a holy and silent night. God continues to act in ordinary days, in moments of decision, and in circumstances that are anything but simple.

In Matthew 2:13–23, we encounter Joseph, a quiet, watchful presence in the Christmas story. He never speaks a word, yet his faith is revealed in attentiveness, trust, and movement. Through Joseph, we glimpse what it can look like to live faithfully after Christmas, when the wonder remains but the world has not been magically transformed.

This Sunday's scripture invites us to reflect on how God stays close, continues to guide, and remains active long after the carols have ended. Faith unfolds not only in celebration, but also in the steady, often unseen steps of everyday life.

As we enter this season after Christmas, let us listen to the story, to one another, and to God's continuing work among us. And let us worship with open hearts, attentive to what God may be saying to us even now.

INFORMATION ON TODAY'S SERVICES

Musicians: Todd Galloway, soloist; David Enos, organist.

About the music: Richard (Irven) Purvis (1913 – 1994) was an American organist, composer, conductor and teacher. He was best known for his expressive recordings of the organ classics and his compositions for the instrument. From 1947 through 1971, Purvis held the position of Organist and Master of Choristers at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, CA. He was also organist at the California Palace of the Legion of Honor. Upon his retirement from Grace Cathedral, he continued to compose, teach and give recitals into his 70s. He died on December 25, 1994. He wrote over 200 compositions.

Joseph Martin (b. 1959), a native of North Carolina, earned his Bachelor of Music degree in Piano Performance at Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina. Subsequently he earned a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance at the University of Texas, Austin. He is a member of the staff of Shawnee Press as Director of Sacred Publications, with responsibilities for overseeing the editorial and creative direction of the company's sacred publications. Joseph lives in Austin, Texas with his children Jonathan and Aubrey and his wife Sue.

Louis-Claude Daquin (1694 – 1772) was a French composer, virtuoso organist and harpsichordist. His Noels are his most well-known organ compositions.
