## A Note from Rev. Dr. Edwin Estevez

Welcome to worship at Kirk in the Hills. Whether you are a longtime member, visiting for the first time, or returning after time away, we are grateful that you are here. Today we begin a new sermon series exploring the biblical theme of mountaintops—those places where people encounter God with clarity, intensity, and lasting impact.

Our journey begins in Genesis 22, with Abraham and Isaac ascending Mount Moriah. This is one of Scripture's most searching stories, pressing us to wrestle with trust, obedience, and the character of God. On the mountain, Abraham comes to see that God is not absent or arbitrary, but faithful and providing. He names the place accordingly: "The LORD will provide." What begins in fear ends in revelation.

For thousands of years, people have climbed mountains seeking divine encounter. Altars were built on high places. Prayers were offered closer to the heavens. Even now, people hike to summits and find themselves overwhelmed by beauty, perspective, and awe. Worship functions much the same way. We gather to rise above the noise of ordinary life, not to escape it, but to see it more truthfully.

These mountaintop encounters are not spiritual detours; they are formative moments that shape identity, vocation, and faithfulness. They reveal who God is—and who we are called to become through Christ.

As you worship today, come expectant and attentive. Let this hour be a holy ascent. Allow Scripture, prayer, music, and silence to open space for God to meet you with grace, perspective, and provision. Come, let us worship the Living God.

## INFORMATION ON TODAY'S SERVICES

**Musicians:** Chantel Woodard, soprano; Amber Rogers, soprano; James Biery and Marilyn Biery, organists and directors.

**About the music:** Jean François-Hyacinthe Langlais III (1907 – 1991) was a French composer and organist, known for his improvisations at the organ. Langlais became blind due to glaucoma at the age of two and was sent to the National Institute for Blind Children in Paris, where he studied the organ with André Marchal. From there he attended the Paris Conservatoire, where he won prizes in organ, studied composition with Marcel Dupré and Paul Dukas and improvisation with Charles Tournemire.

On April 4, 1968, at 6:01 p.m., Dr. Martin Luther King was shot while standing on the second-floor balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, surrounded by friends and associates. As he lay dying, he spoke these last words to his friend and musician Ben Branch, who was to perform at the event King was scheduled to attend that night: "Ben, make sure you play 'Take My Hand, Precious Lord' in the meeting tonight. Play it real pretty." King's funeral took place on April 9, 1968, at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, the church where both King and his father had served as co-pastors. His good friend Mahalia Jackson sang "Precious Lord" at the funeral.

Francis Hall Johnson (1888 – 1970) was an American composer and arranger of African American spiritual music. He attended the private, all-black Knox Institute in Athens, Georgia, and earned a degree from Allen University in Columbia, South Carolina. He also attended Atlanta University, the Juilliard School, Hahn School of Music, and the University of Pennsylvania. Johnson said of the spiritual: "True enough, this music was transmitted to us through humble channels, but its source is that of all great art everywhere—the unquenchable, divinely human longing for a perfect realization of life. It traverses every shade of emotion without spilling over in any direction. Its most tragic utterances are without pessimism, and its lightest, brightest moments have nothing to do with frivolity. In its darkest expressions there is always a hope, and in its gayest measures a constant reminder."
