REV. DR. EDWIN ESTEVEZ



Lent invites us into a sacred pilgrimage—forty days of reflection, repentance, and renewal, as we walk with Jesus toward the cross and onward to the joy of the empty tomb. This year, our Lenten worship theme is “Praying with Jesus”—an invitation to encounter the challenge, comfort, and transforming power of prayer.

Throughout the season, we will listen carefully to the prayers of Christ: his silence in suffering, his gratitude at table, his longing for unity, his joy in the Spirit, his lament over Jerusalem, and even his anguished cry from the cross. In learning how Jesus prays, we will learn how to trust the One whom Jesus called, “Abba, Father” more deeply—and to live with courageous faith.

Our journey begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 18**, with services at Noon and 7:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary for our Imposition of Ashes liturgy, remembering both our mortality and God’s grace. In the weeks that follow, we will celebrate Communion and Baptism, mark Bible Sunday, and commission Stephen Ministers, believers trained to walk with people through both difficult and joyful times. These are visible signs that Christ continues his work among us.

Holy Week will draw us to the very heart of the Gospel. On Palm Sunday, we will begin outdoors with a joyful reenactment of Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem. **Maundy Thursday** will feature Journey to Jerusalem, an immersive service of Scripture, music, candlelight, and the Lord’s Supper, preceded by our Family Communion Service with foot washing. On **Good Friday**, we will gather in solemn prayer at the foot of the cross. On **Easter Sunday**, from sunrise in the Columbarium to festive worship in the Sanctuary and celebration on the front lawn, we will proclaim with glad hearts: Christ is risen!

Our whole season is for seekers, children and their families, and long-time Christians. Whether you have long called the Kirk home or are seeking a place to belong this Lent, I invite you: Come and worship. Come and pray. Come and walk this sacred road with us. As we learn to pray like Jesus, may we be drawn ever closer to the heart of God—and may Easter morning find us renewed, restored, and rejoicing.
