DRESS CODE:

While at camp, we ask students and adults to:

- •Wear modest shorts. When hands are extended to the back or the front, fingertips must touch fabric. Sleeveless shirts and tank tops are now allowed during daytime activities. Shirts with spaghetti straps, open backs or excessive armpit cutouts which expose torso and undergarments are NOT allowed. Large t-shirts that cover shorts should not be worn.
- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities.
- Wear modest shorts, pants, jeans, or dresses for worship. Dresses with spaghetti or small straps, open backs, and excessively short lengths are unacceptable (when hands are allowed in worship.
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.

Make sure your students do NOT pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person. Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
- Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, except for sleepwear.

NOTE: Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately.

WHAT TO PACK

- Clothes for 7-9 days (you will want to have multiple sets of clothing for each day, if you desire to change at night, we will be outside a good portion of the day.)
- Sleep bag or twin-size sheets
- Blanket and pillow
- Refillable water bottle (This is a MUST and it cannot be a disposable plastic bottle.)
- Comfortable closed toed, closed heeled shoes (whole foot must be covered)
- 2 Towels (showering and outdoor activities)
- Sun protection
- All toiletry items needed (toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc.)
- Smaller bag for carrying things around
- Modest Swimsuit (see dress code)
- CHAPSTICK
- Bag for wet clothes
- Pen, small journal
- Bible
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Family decision on cell phones.

WHAT NOT TO PACK

- · Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string NOTE: Pranks are not allowed at camp. Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up.
- iPads, iPods, gaming devices, roller blades or skateboards NOTE: If students bring cell phones or other electronics, they are not to be out and in use during programming elements: Morning Celebrating, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation, and Track Times/Ministry Tracks.

Expectations for Clothing:

- Clothing (shorts and shirts) should always be modest in length and tightness but also comfortable
- Please do not wear crop tops or anything that shows midriff
- Ladies Swimsuits should be one piece only, covering chest, stomach, and bottom. Tankinis are OK.
- Guys swim trunks & board shorts are great. No speedos.
- Shirts and shorts must be worn to and from swimming areas

CAMP RULES

Please share these rules with your child:

CELL PHONES

- The decision of cell phone usage at camp is in the hands of the Group Leader of each church.
- Throughout the week, some elements may allow students and adults to join in via social media (i.e., Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, etc.) However, these opportunities are optional and will not limit the camp experience for those who do not participate.
- Unless instructed by staff, students with cell phones are not allowed to have them out or in use during programming elements: Morning Celebration, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation and Track Times/Ministry Tracks. Ringers should be turned to silent or vibrate.
- **FBG STUDENT POLICY:** We will warn them to put the phone away during appropriate times, if it continues to be an issue we will take their phone and contact parents to let you know. We haven't had to go that far and hope to not have to!

ACTIVITIES

- Participate in all activities and be on time.
- Drink plenty of water and eat three meals a day.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes to recreation and ministry sites.
- Wear your nametag at all times.
- Name calling, fighting, bullying, arguing, profanity or any other aggressive behaviors are strictly prohibited at camp. Play safely and use good sportsmanship.
- Always have a buddy. Don't go it alone.

HOUSING

- No guys in girls' rooms or hallways and no girls in guys' rooms or hallways.
- No public displays of affection.
- No practical jokes.
- Housing areas should be kept clean, in order, and free from damage. Churches will be responsible for any damage to the room.
- Valuables such as money, jewelry and phones should be properly safeguarded.
- All campers are expected to respect the rights and property of others. Loud noise and similar intrusive behaviors are prohibited.
- Athletic activities such as running, playing and throwing are prohibited in housing areas. These and similar activities are to be done outside.

WORSHIP

- No gum, food, or drinks allowed in the worship center.
- No video and flash photography are allowed in the worship center before or during the worship service.
- If campers must leave to go to the restroom, they should have an adult sponsor escort them. Make sure students go to the restroom before they go to worship.

Training

A good portion of each day will be devoted to training and equipping students to adopt an on mission lifestyle. We will also provide leaders who will serve with your group to model, assist, and encourage the students to make the most of every opportunity.

Worship

What you can expect

The primary missional activity will be outreach to immigrants and refugees in Ft. Worth. There are several apartment complexes that are filled with refugees who have been resettled in the United States. Some things your students will do at the apartment complexes include:

- Leading Backyard Bible Clubs
