The Second Lesson | Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."





COMPOSER OF THE WEEK This Sunday's offertory anthem, "Like as the hart desireth the waterbrooks," is one of the most celebrated choral anthems by the English composer Herbert Howells, who composed the piece in a single day in 1941 while he and his wife were "mewed up by snow" in a Gloucestershire cottage during World War II. It is known for its elegant passion, sensuous harmonies, and shifting tonalities that capture the emotional depth of the psalmist's longing for God amidst suffering. Howells is a mainstay of the Anglican choral repertoire, with good reason: 'I have composed out of sheer love of trying to make nice sounds', he writes, in acknowledgement of his instantly recognizable, rich harmonic language and his seemingly endless streams of melody woven together.



SUMMARY OF NOVEMBER VESTRY MEETING

The Vestry met on Wednesday, December 17, 2025, at 5:30 P.M.

Simon opened the meeting with prayer, and Ross Nicholas delivered the meditation.

Sheldon Taylor delivered the Treasurer's update and noted that the Finance Committee continues to project that All Saints' will finish 2025 with a balanced budget. The Finance Committee approved the 2026 budget for review and approval by the Vestry. After Nancy Dodson reviewed the proposed 2026 budget in detail, the Vestry approved it.

Sheldon Taylor has agreed to serve as the Chair of the Block Development Steering Committee that will oversee the execution of the entire master plan for the Block over the next several years. Meg Fogel updated the Vestry on the work on the Egleston Task Force. The task force engaged North Avenue Partners as project manager and sent an RFP to seven potential architects for proposals. Responses from the architects are due on January 14. The Vestry continues to emphasize that the work on the Block will always honor the historic nature of our campus.

The meeting closed with prayer and was adjourned.
