





## The First Lesson | Acts 1:6-14

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

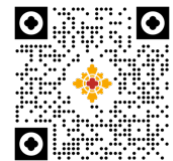

**COMPOSER OF THE WEEK** Jennifer Page Kess Velázquez is a versatile concert organist who has performed across the globe, from the historic churches of London and Scotland to the concert halls of Ukraine. Throughout her career, she has collaborated with world-class ensembles like the Memphis Symphony Orchestra and renowned composers such as Dan Forrest. A graduate of the prestigious Eastman School of Music, she spent 25 years shaping the music program of a major Presbyterian church before bringing her talents to Boston. Beyond live performances, her artistry is captured on several professional albums, including a solo recording titled *Lauda Anima*. Today, she remains a prominent figure in the New England music scene, performing at iconic venues like Boston's King's Chapel and Trinity Church. Her new hymntune, *Known By God*, is the winner of the 2026 American Guild of Organists Women Composer's Sunday competition.

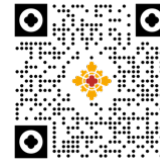
