Dr. Jemar Tisby is the author of the New York Times bestselling book, *The Color of Compromise: The Truth about the Church's Complicity in Racism*, and the award-winning *How to Fight Racism*. His latest book is *How to Fight Racism: Young Reader's Edition*. Jemar has been a co-host of the "Pass the Mic" podcast since its inception seven years ago. His writing has been featured in the *Washington Post*, *The Atlantic*, and the *New York Times* among others. He is a frequent commentator on outlets such as NPR and CNN's New Day program. He speaks nationwide on the topics of racial justice, U.S. history, and religion. Jemar earned his PhD in history with a focus on race, religion, and social movements in the 20th century. Dr. Jemar Tisby recently joined the faculty of Simmons College

Worship Service of Truth-telling, Lament and Commitment Combined Worship - Sunday, October 22, at 11:15 a.m.

When the 200th Anniversary Team began planning our year of celebration, we knew remembering and honoring our history would be part of the festivities. At the same time, we recognized that we could not celebrate the beautiful aspects of our past without giving an honest account of our church's historical connection to slavery. We have acknowledged our past sins from the beginning of our anniversary celebration. The Racial Justice Team and our pastoral staff have crafted a combined worship service of Truth-telling, Lament, and Commitment that will be held on Sunday, October 22, at 11:15 a.m. The purpose of the service is to give an account of the extent of our connection to slavery and recognize the enslaved people who were impacted by our distorted view of the gospel. We are going to read the names of the enslaved persons, lament our church's involvement in this evil practice, and recommit ourselves to the work of seeking racial justice.
