Rediscovering Jesus: A Lenten Series

In Matthew 16, Jesus is walking with his disciples when he asks the question, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" They share that some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, and still others one of the prophets. But Peter answers, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God. This question, "who is Jesus?", will guide us through the Lenten season. The truth is, Jesus is a lot of things to a lot of people. Chances are one word isn't enough to capture your view of Jesus either. After all, Jesus is the son of the living God, but Jesus is also a prophet, a friend, and a teacher. Our Lenten worship series is based on Diana Butler Bass' book — *Freeing Jesus: Rediscovering Jesus as Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way, and Presence.* Throughout Lent, we will dive into her book and rediscover Jesus, learning there are more facets to the Son of the Living God than we could ever imagine.
