JUNE 4 Guest Preacher, Wallace Hartsfield

A gifted and prophetic preacher, Wallace Hartsfield serves as the Pastor of Metropolitan Missionary Baptist Church. He also has a Ph.D. in Hebrew Bible and is an Associate Professor of Hebrew Bible at Central Baptist Theological Seminary. In addition, he acts as the CEO of Field of Hearts Productions, a musical production company that began as a



joint venture between him and his wife. Rev. Hartsfield has become an influential figure in the Kansas City African American community and is a crucial spokesperson for social and economic justice across the metro area.

JUNE 11 Guest Preacher, Pam Durso

President Pamela R. Durso serves as the 11th president of Central Seminary in Shawnee, Kansas, where she began her tenure on June 1, 2020. Prior to her leadership at Central, Dr. Durso was executive director of Baptist Women in Ministry for 11 years, and there she was a resource for women serving in all areas of Christian ministry. From 1999-2003, Dr. Durso was assistant professor of church history and



Baptist heritage at Campbell University Divinity School in Buies Creek, North Carolina, and for ten years, she was an adjunct faculty member at McAfee School of Theology in Atlanta. She is the author and/or editor of ten books, including The Story of Baptists in the United States, which she co-wrote with her husband Keith.
