- **1.** Read Exodus 7:5. God demonstrated His power in relevant, understandable ways to the Egyptians, confronting their false beliefs head-on. What are relevant ways you've seen God reveal His power through the church to impact culture today?
- 2. Read Exodus 9:1-7, 10:21-23, and 2 Samuel 22:29. Pastor Tom shared how God uses His power precisely and justly to "both comfort and confront, encourage and challenge, rebuke and restore simultaneously in the right people's lives." Which of these phrases describes how God is working in and through you now? Explain.
- **3.** Read Exodus 8:16-19. God's power is unmatchable. How does God's unmatched power give you unique perspective when facing life experiences?
- **4.** Read Numbers 11:29b and Ephesians 5:18. God invites you to be filled with His Holy Spirit and rely on His power. What obstacles or attitudes do you need to surrender to God to embrace this invitation?
- **5.** As a group, pick a time to remind one another to be filled with the Holy Spirit each day this week (via text, group chats, etc.). Then, at your next group session, unpack how the week went and your takeaways from the experience.



"Power Supply"

To live on purpose, I need <u>power</u> to do it.

After his first disastrous meeting with Pharaoh (note **Exodus 5**), Moses realized he needed more than just <u>truthful</u> words to deal with Pharaoh and fulfill God's plan to free the people of Israel from slavery.

What do we need to know about <u>God's</u> power that we can learn from Moses' life and experience?

## 1. God's Power Is Relevant

#### Note Exodus 7:5

- The plague of blood affected the Nile River (central to Egyptian life and considered the god <u>Hapi</u>).
- Frogs (goddess Heget).
- Livestock/animal deities (bull and cow gods).
- Darkness was an insult to the Sun-god Ra (Re), a chief deity.

God was contrasting His <u>genuine</u> power to the false power of the Egyptian gods.

Note Exodus 7:22-24

Egyptian magicians = priests with <u>occultic</u> abilities.

### Note **Exodus 8:6-8**, **12-15**

God also wants to reveal His power in and through us in relevant/ understandable ways that can be <u>grasped</u> and comprehended by ordinary people.

## 2. God's Power Is Precise

God's power is <u>always</u> used in precise ways (note **Exodus 9:1-7**). He uses His power <u>justly</u>.

He demonstrates His glory and power by keeping one group of people who mistakenly worshipped the Sun as a god *in the dark*; while at the same time keeping another group of people who for 4 centuries were thought to be *in the dark*...in the <u>brightness</u> of His light (note **Exodus 10:21-23, 2 Samuel 22:29**).

God's power in and through us can both comfort and confront, encourage and challenge, rebuke and restore <u>simultaneously</u> in the right people's lives.

# 3. God's Power Is Unmatched

Note **Exodus 7:11, 22**; **8:7**, **16-19a** *Finger* of God...

Note **Exodus 31:18**; **Daniel 5**; **John 8:3-11**; **Luke 11:20** God's power is unmatched and utterly unique.
