- **5.** What are some ways that you personally (or your group) can help others experience this Christmas Peace in Jesus? Spend some time thinking, praying and brainstorming on this, and record some of your ideas in your attendance notes for all our groups to learn from. 2. Knowing the Real Peace of Christmas
