- **3.** When you think of Jesus praying for Peter (**Luke 22:31-32**, **61-62**) despite what was coming, how does this give you confidence of Him extending mercy to you when you fail (sin)?
- 4. "But Jesus prayed for Peter...and when Jesus prays for people, it makes all the difference." (Read Luke 24:8-12α). Peter had not yet had his restorative beach-front reunion with Jesus yet...so why was he running to the tomb? (John 21:1-19)
- 5. Jesus is tirelessly praying for you (Hebrews 7:25, 9:24-26) and "The focus of His prayers for us is on our greatest need = forgiveness and freedom from guilt and shame." What are some areas where you need to welcome God's mercy into your life?
- **6.** As you <u>personally</u> experience the mercy of Jesus, how can you then extend that same mercy in practical ways to those around you?

And we also have a bit of a conflicted attitude towards mercy:

- We desperately want it for ourselves, but...
- ...but we are less likely to want to see others <u>receive</u> it, either from us or even from God.

Prayer Was <u>Central</u> to Jesus' Life and Mission

- Jesus prayed at his <u>baptism</u> (note **Luke 3:21**).
- After His baptism the Holy Spirit leads Him into the wilderness to pray and fast for 40 days (note **Matthew 4:1**).
- He prayed before His <u>first</u> public preaching ministry (note Mark 1:35-38).
- He prays all night before choosing 12 disciples (note **Luke 6:12-13a**).
- He prays before feeding both the 5,000 (**John 6:11**) and the 4,000 (**Mark 8:6**).
- After feeding the 5,000 He prayed alone <u>late</u> into the evening (note **Matthew 14:22-23**).
- He prayed His High <u>Priestly</u> prayer... (John 17).
- He prayed after healing a leper (note Luke 5:16) and as He healed a deaf man (note Mark 7:32-37).
- He prayed after hearing the report of the <u>72</u> disciples He sent out on His mission (note **Luke 10:21**).
- He was praying when He was transfigured (note Luke 9:28-29).
- He prayed over little children (note Mark 10:13-16).
- He prayed <u>over</u> Jerusalem (note Matthew 23:37-39).
- He taught His disciples to pray (note **Luke 11:1-2a**).
- Note Hebrews 5:7



Jesus knew Peter was going to <u>fail</u> Him... (note **Luke 22:33-34**, **54-62**). But that didn't stop Him from praying for Peter to help him, <u>restore</u> him, and strengthen him.

Note **Luke 22:61**

...Peter's sense of incredible failure <u>overwhelmed</u> him (note **Luke 22:62**). This could have completely <u>defined</u> the rest of his life and legacy.

But Jesus prayed for Peter...

...and when Jesus prays for people, it makes all the difference.

Note Luke 24:8-12a

3. Jesus Prays for <u>Us</u> (note **Hebrews 7:25**)

Jesus' ministry of intercession only <u>expanded</u> beyond anything it was during His earthly ministry (note **Hebrews 9:24**).

If you are a Jesus follower, you have the most consistent, effective, powerful, and wonderful Prayer <u>Partner</u> there is.

He is never too <u>tired</u>, too distracted, or too uninterested to pray for you (note **Romans 8:33-34**).

The focus of His prayers for us is on our greatest need = forgiveness and <u>freedom</u> from guilt and shame.

Our responsibility (note 1 John 1:8-9).

At that moment, Jesus intercedes for us (note 1 John 2:1)...

Am I welcoming God's mercy into my life?

• One of the greatest gifts for people who need mercy (<u>everyone!</u>), is His praying for us.
