- Icebreaker -

You find \$100 on the ground, there's no one around, nowhere to turn it in...it's yours.

What do you do next?

- 1. Read John 21:1-6. If you were Peter, what would you have been doing to stay busy and keep the memories of what you'd done at bay? Been doing much of that lately? Don't answer that out loud...yet.
- **2.** Do you believe that what you've done is worse than Peter; that Jesus could never forgive you? Take some time to process that thought after reading **John 21:7-14** and **2 Timothy 2:13**.
- **3.** Share some examples of experiencing God's mercy with your group—broad strokes are fine, leave time for everyone to share. How can you share the amazing truth of God's mercy with those in your sphere of influence?
- **4.** Peter and Jesus have a come to...well you get the idea. How does Jesus use parts of Peter's own failure to restore him, and in turn set Peter on a path of true greatness? Read **John 21:15-17**.
- **5.** We all fail, just like Peter and Judas. Next time you fail, how will you welcome God's mercy into that failure, even when it stings more than a bit?!

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God's mercy impacts every aspect of our lives and every <u>single</u> one of our relationships.

While mercy is one of the primary attributes of God, it's not always the easiest thing to really <u>understand</u> and fully get our arms around.

- We desperately want it for ourselves, but...
- ...but we are less <u>likely</u> to want to see others receive it, either from us or even from God.

1. When We're <u>Down</u>, Jesus Shows Us Mercy

Note **John 21:1-6**

Jesus could have easily told Peter that their lousy fishing result was a <u>sign</u> to him that this is what he deserved because of his denials and failures.

Note Luke 5:1-11; John 21:7-14

God's mercy isn't based on what we deserve.

God's mercy is based on Who He is.

Note Lamentations 3:22-23

God will never give up on you (note 2 Timothy 2:13).

2. Jesus Builds His Church Through Imperfect People Who Need His Mercy (note Luke 22:32)

Note **John 21:15-17**

Peter had failed miserably and been completely unfaithful to Jesus, and Jesus didn't <u>ignore</u> his 3 denials.

Remember, we have to welcome/embrace God's mercy into our lives.

God never wastes anything, even our failures.

The only people Jesus has available to use are <u>failures</u>, because everyone has failed. (note **Romans 3:23**).

The Church of Jesus has been built by failures for 2,000 years.

Am I welcoming God's mercy into my life?

- Two of Jesus' closest friends failed Him big-time.
- Judas became a traitor...
- ...Peter became an apostle and <u>fisher</u> of men.
- Judas had a <u>breakdown</u>...
- ...Peter had a <u>breakthrough</u>.
- Judas <u>rejected</u> God's mercy...
- ...Peter <u>received</u> and embraced God's mercy.
- Will we welcome God's mercy into our lives, or will we resist God's mercy?
- What will you <u>become</u> because of how you decide to navigate your failures?
