- **5.** Why can grace seem too easy to believe, making us doubt if it's enough vs. doing the "hard work" of following the law...God's or other's?

If God is merciful and forgiving, then why <u>strive</u> for a holy life?
If Jesus paid the <u>penalty</u> for our sins, then why should we be concerned about experiencing life change and transformation?

### 4. Grace Means God Lowered His Standards

Many times we tend to think about God as having a <u>split</u> personality... Grace isn't God abandoning His Law but sending Jesus to completely <u>fulfill</u> it (note <u>Matthew 5:17-19</u>).

The Old Testament is clear about what is most <u>important</u> to God (note Micah 6:6-8; Psalm 51:16-17; Leviticus 19:18; Deuteronomy 6:5).

Jesus lived a perfect, sinless life and fulfilled the actual <u>meaning</u> of the Law where God's people had previously failed.

Note Galatians 5:14; 3:1-4; Matthew 7:12; Mark 12:28-31

#### 5. Grace Means That Effort Doesn't Matter

Note Ephesians 2:8-9; Galatians 3:6-7, 11

Grace is not opposed to effort, it is opposed to <u>earning</u>. (Willard)

To love others like Jesus, to serve Him wholeheartedly, to be generous, to share Jesus with others takes effort; but effort <u>fueled</u> by grace (note **Ephesians 2:10; Philippians 2:12-13**).

Grace allows us to look at our entire life after we say 'YES!' to Jesus as Lord as a thank-you note to Jesus...

### 6. Grace Means Godly People are the Recipients

Misconception = God loves <u>good</u> people rather than that God's love makes people <u>good</u>.

Note Luke 10:25-29; 18:18-27; Philippians 3:3b-11

Grace is for ungodly people, but it sets them on a new life <u>pathway</u> that transforms people's lives into Jesus' image... (note **2 Corinthians 3:18**).

### Is it Enough?

• Saying 'YES!' to Jesus is more than an <u>emotional</u> decision, but a commitment to a brand-new life.
