- Not comfortable, but <u>inconvenienced</u>. (v.12)
- Not selective, but <u>unfiltered</u>. (v.13)
- Not reactive, but gracious. (v.14)
- Not unresponsive, but <u>empathetic</u>. (v. 15)
- Not competitive, but <u>humble</u>. (v.16)
