- Icebreaker -

When vacationing, what is the one place or activity that rejuvenates you most?

- 1. Read Galatians 6:2; Ephesians 4:2; and Colossians 3:13. The call to humility when dealing with a difficult person or someone who has done you wrong is not just challenging, but can even feel offensive. What helps you regain (or maintain) a humble perspective in such circumstances?
- 2. Pastor Tom said that "bearing with one another is the prelude to forgiving one another..." (Colossians 3:13) suggesting that forgiving someone when angry, disgusted, or offended is unfeasible. How do you get over these emotions? Read Colossians 3:1-2; 10, 12 and discuss God's answers to this very human conundrum.
- **3.** Like humility, gentleness seems counterintuitive in these situations and requires what Pastor Tom called a "character qualification." Read **Ephesians 4:2**; **Colossians 3:12**; and **Galatians 6:1**. What is that qualification and what steps can you take to develop it in your life?
- 4. Pastor Tom indicated that for the fallen Jesus follower to experience forgiveness, it "requires a willing attitude and actions..." If you have walked through that process what/ who helped you see what was needed to take steps toward forgiveness and restoration?
- 5. Is there someone you need to forgive or help restore to a healthy place with God? If so, Pastor Tom said that you will need to "release any bitterness" you may harbor to forgive them and "depend on the Holy Spirit in a new way" to help them pick up their lives again. What steps will you take this week?



People-ing 101: Building Community One Story at a Time "BEAR WITH ONE ANOTHER"

How can the <u>most</u> connected culture in human history be struggling so much to find meaningful relationships?

Loneliness isn't a 21st century <u>problem</u>...

The good news is that God sees us and knows all about us, and He knows how to address the problem of <u>loneliness</u>.

Note Galatians 6:2; Ephesians 4:2; Colossians 3:13

We don't naturally bear with each other's problems, inconsistencies, and <u>hypocrisy</u>.

l. <u>Forgiving</u> One Another (note Colossians 3:1-17)

Note Colossians 3:1-2, 5-9, 10 & 12, 13

Bear = to hold oneself up against...to <u>put up</u> with...endure.

Bearing with one another is the <u>prelude</u> to forgiving one another...

To bear with each other describes the unpleasant and difficult aspect of forgiving others = <u>suffering</u>.

2. Restoring One Another (note Galatians 6:1-3)

In Galatians 6, bearing with each other takes forgiveness to the next step (note **Galatians 6:1a**, NIV = caught in a sin).

Not a tiny <u>flaw</u>, but a critical, moral/ethical failure.

A <u>character</u> qualification for those helping to restore others (note **Galatians 6:1** = spiritually minded...walking by the rule of the Spirit...keeping in step with the Spirit).

The proper <u>approach</u> = <u>gently</u> (note **Galatians 5:22**).

The right <u>attitude</u> needed (note **Galatians 6:1b** = <u>humility</u>). Restore = literally a surgical term for setting of <u>broken</u> bones. Overcome/caught in a sin...trapped - <u>crushed</u> by sin's consequences... Note **Galatians 6:2** = carry/bear = to lift/take up.

Here we are talking about...one who has harassed the church and brought <u>immeasurable</u> grief to Christian hearts. Yet he who caused the trouble is a person for whom Christ died. He is a Christian in <u>grave</u> error. Restore him in love. Bear his burden. He has failed to be a Christian. <u>You</u> be a Christian. (Blackwood)

When we carry each other's burdens (heavy, <u>crushing</u> load) we fulfill the law of Christ (note **Galatians 5:14**).

There is another side of the coin in restoration:

- It's not a license to do evil.
- It requires a willing attitude and actions on the part of the fallen
 Jesus follower to sincerely <u>repent</u> and submit to a process of
 restoration.

Note Ephesians 4:2 and Galatians 6:1-3

Forgiving and restoring one another opens doors of opportunity to demonstrate God's grace to each other and make God's love <u>practical</u>.

SO MY NEXT STEP IN PEOPLE-ING 101:

- <u>Release</u> any bitterness/unforgiveness/desire for revenge towards another and embrace God's grace to be willing to forgive and restore another.
- Or <u>admit</u> we're a fallen/backslidden Jesus follower and we need to sincerely repent and submit to a process of restoration.
- Or <u>depend</u> on the Holy Spirit in a new way to help a fallen Jesus follower to put the broken pieces of their lives back together as they turn back to Jesus.
- ...understand that Jesus <u>exemplified</u> what it means to bear with each other...
