

# **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

- Icebreaker -

If you had to describe your personality in terms of a farm animal, which animal would you choose and why?

- 1. In this *People-ing* series, we have looked at how Jesus followers are meant to be connected to one another. Pastor Tom said that taking the next step of baptism is a key way for that connection to deepen. If you've been baptized, how has that experience impacted your relationships at Riverside?
- 2. These passages (Acts 2:29-41, 8:4-13, 26-39, 9:1-19, 16:11-15; 18:1-8, & 19:1-5), describe how Saul/Paul, and thousands of other new Jesus followers, were baptized soon after saying 'YES!' to Jesus. What excuses have you heard (or used) that keep Christians from obeying the Biblical call to believer's baptism?
- **3.** Pastor Tom said that baptism is a symbol of what Jesus has done in you for all to see. What "sermon without words" would/ has your baptism declare/d to all those who know you, and how does it invite them to say 'YES!' to Jesus too?
- **4.** Pastor Tom taught that baptism, whether done to you as an infant or chosen as an adult, is no substitute for saying your own 'YES!' to Jesus. No form of baptism saves you; only Jesus can do that. This is a perfect time to say your 'YES!' and then be baptized next Sunday. Will you say your 'YES!' right now?
- **5.** On Sunday 7/27, we will celebrate together those taking their next step of baptism at our baptism service at the Becker Community Center. Who are you inviting to share in this next step of faith in your life or in the lives of others you love, and who might you encourage to take their next step with you?



# People-ing 101: Building Community One Story at a Time "TAKING NEXT STEPS WITH ONE ANOTHER"

Multiple studies show that despite living in the most connected time in human history, people of all generations are <u>lonelier</u> than ever. As we've been exploring the past 8 weeks God's way for us to navigate the problem of loneliness through the *one <u>anothers</u>*, let's look at how important it is for us to take next steps with one another, especially the vital next step of baptism:

#### What the New Testament Teaches About Water Baptism

- A. Meaning of baptism = "Baptizo" = "to dip...to immerse"
  - I would have those who are to be baptized to be <u>entirely</u> immersed, as the work imports and the mystery signifies. (Martin Luther)
  - The word 'baptize' signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the <u>ancient</u> church. (John Calvin)
  - Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the <u>custom</u> of the first church. (John Wesley)
- B. John the Baptist his ministry shows us that baptism was not a new idea invented by Christians, or even by John the Baptist.
  - Baptism = always a <u>symbolic</u> act.
  - John the "<u>Baptizer</u>" practiced a baptism that symbolized repentance (note **Matthew 3:7-11a**).
- C. Baptism of Jesus His baptism symbolized:
  - It was to "fulfill all righteousness" (note Matthew 3:15).
  - Fulfilled the mission of John the Baptist and marked the <u>start</u> of Jesus' public ministry.
  - Jesus <u>identified</u> Himself with the sinful condition of humanity which He had come to save.
  - It is an <u>example</u> to all His followers.
- D. Other New Testament Examples baptism practiced very soon after commitment to Jesus Christ, so much so that often baptism and salvation are closely <u>tied</u> together:
  - Acts 2, Pentecost
  - Acts 8, Samarian converts and Ethiopian government official
  - Acts 9, Saul of Tarsus
  - Acts 16, Lydia of Thyatira and Philippian jailer and his household
  - Acts 18, believers in Corinth
  - Acts 19, Ephesian disciples

Every example of baptism in the New Testament is believer's baptism (no examples of infant baptism). Note Matthew 28:18-20

Baptism is an outward <u>sign</u> and symbol of what has happened inwardly/personally/and spiritually to a person when they say 'YES!' to Jesus as Lord. The <u>act</u> of baptism does not make anyone a Jesus follower...

## 2. Make His Faith Known

For Saul/Paul to be baptized challenged his <u>religious</u> heritage and education, as well as his pride. Note Acts 9:18

### **3.** Connect with God's <u>Family</u> (note Acts 9:19b)

Baptism was his invitation to also <u>connect</u> with Jesus' followers in Jerusalem (note Acts 9:26-28).

Spiritual growth happens in relationships, not isolation.

#### Share Your Story (note Acts 9:20)

Baptism is both a <u>public</u> declaration of our faith and a sermon without words (note Romans 6:4-5).

Baptism sets us on a course to be both inviters (come and sit with me) and witnesses (here's what Jesus did for me).

## 5. Keep Taking Next Steps

Note Acts 9:21, 22 Baptism sets us on a course to taking next steps and growing stronger in our walk with Jesus. Note Matthew 28:19
