

DISCUSSION GUIDE

- Icebreaker -

If your pet (or the pet of someone you visit frequently if you don't have one) got to write the epitaph for your tombstone, what do you imagine it might be?

- 1. Pastor Tony spoke of the confusion and frustration of being "stuck in the space in between" with all its waiting, uncertainty, and tension. When was the last time you experienced that "space" and how did you respond to it?
- 2. Pastor Tony suggested that the Christians described in James 4:1-3 are examples of the "scramble" we go through when we try to resolve the tension of the "space in between" our old life and our new life in Christ. What did it/does it look like when you try to resolve that tension on your own and how successful have you been?
- **3.** Read Luke 4:14-24. Pastor Tony indicated that in these verses, Jesus revealed to his hometown that He had come to bring about an exchange of the old and broken for the new and redeemed, but his community rejected Him. Why do some reject this invitation or why did you reject it before you finally said 'YES!' to Jesus?
- **4.** Read the "actual offer" in **Isaiah 61:3**, noting the exchanges mentioned. If you were going to continue this list based on what Jesus has done for you after you said 'YES!', what exchanges would you include?
- Pastor Tony challenged each of us to "call out the sin solution" to the "space in between", which is really no solution at all, and say 'YES!' to the solution God offers to us, which is the only real solution: Jesus! If you have yet to say 'YES!' to Jesus' invitation, what is keeping you from letting go of your broken solution and grabbing onto Jesus?



The Space in Between

"THE GREAT EXCHANGE"

Think of the last time it happened...

The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the brokenhearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed. He has sent me to tell those who mourn that the time of the Lord's favor has come. (Isaiah 61:1-2, referenced by Jesus in Luke 4)

We often feel stuck in the "space in between" - moments when we're <u>not</u> where we were, but not yet where we want to be.

- These moments can feel confusing, frustrating, and discouraging...or can become wonder-filled.
- What can we do with the waiting, the uncertainty, the tension? And where's God in all of it?

Satisfaction guaranteed? (see James 4:1-3)

- When we aren't satisfied, we uniquely scramble.
- The real ache isn't just about what happened to you, but about what you're still missing.
- (Spoiler alert: Your deepest desires don't go away just because you're doing <u>spiritual things</u>.)

Isaiah 61:1-2: Who is revealing the exchange?

- It's easy to <u>overlook God</u> in someone who is <u>familiar</u>. (Luke 4:14-16, 21-24)
- A striking message comes best from a <u>stricken messenger</u>.
- When do you most tend to send God's person in your life <u>toward a</u> cliff? (Luke 4:28-30)

Isaiah 61:3: What is the actual offer?

- This isn't <u>cosmetic</u> or <u>emotional</u> help...
 it's the <u>whole</u> LIFE of Jesus in your <u>whole</u> life...
 it's His <u>authority</u> over your strong <u>conclusions</u>. (Luke 4:31-32)
- God invites us to give Him what's been hurting us and to <u>stop</u> <u>grabbing it back</u>.
- What if we could trade what's been weighing us down for something better <u>God Himself?</u>
- It's not about a tweak or an adjustment but an actual exchange.
 - Lay down your <u>aching identity</u> and humbly <u>receive your</u> <u>crowning</u>.

Isaiah 61:4: What happens next?

- Call out the "sin solution" in your life.
- Extend the exchange to others by example, story-telling and invitation. (Acts 26:17-18)

WHAT CAN I DO IN THE SPACE IN BETWEEN?:

- Jesus already made His choice He <u>chose you</u>.
 Now you get to make your choice and <u>choose Him</u>. (John 1:12)
- Faith isn't about pretending everything's fine. It's about being honest enough to say, "This isn't working," and reaching for what God is offering... <u>Himself (+ etc)</u>.
- Now, decide what you'll let go of and what you'll grab on to. (Luke 9:23)
