
If you never had to pay for food again at the restaurant of your choice, which restaurant would you pick and why?

- 2. Read 2 Chronicles 20:7, James 2:23, Genesis 12:9-17. Abraham was called a "friend of God," even though he still had doubts about trusting God with the details of his life. How do you respond to knowing your doubts don't disqualify you from friendship with God?
- **3.** Three times the Scriptures show Abraham trying to manipulate the situation by being clever rather than by trusting God at His word (Genesis 12:11-17; 16:1-5; 20:1b-3). Share a time when your doubts caused you to depend on your cleverness rather than God. How did that work out?
- **4.** Pastor Tom stated, "Abraham didn't earn friendship with God...It was simply a gift of God's grace." Where do you need to stop trying to earn God's friendship and just accept His grace?
- **5.** How does God's trust in Abraham, even knowing all of his shortcomings past, present and future, encourage you to trust God with your life despite your *own* shortcomings? (**Genesis 18:17**; **John 15:14-15**)
- **6.** By grace, Jesus desires and invites you to be His friend. What doubts are keeping you from saying "YES!" to Jesus today?

#### 1. God's Friend

What names would you like to put on your resume as a <u>reference</u>? Note **2 Chronicles 20:7**; **Isaiah 41:8**; **James 2:23** 

Though thoroughly <u>unknown</u> and chosen by God for no apparent reason, he was a remarkable person.

He's not just listed in Hebrews 11 (Faith Hall of Fame), but he's <u>referred</u> to more often in Hebrews 11 than anyone else.

...you can see so many experiences where Abraham demonstrated a <u>beautiful</u> faith:


- Enthusiastic <u>obedience</u>
   (note Genesis 12:1, 4-5; James 2:20-23; John 15:14)
- Heartfelt worship (note Genesis 12:6-8)
- Risk-taking trust (note Genesis 15:6, 22:15-18)

### 2. God's <u>Imperfect</u> Friend

If you graph Abraham's life, it will look like a <u>rollercoaster</u> between faith and doubt.

This graph shows us that God's friends fail and doubt; but when they <u>stumble</u>, they don't stay there long; and to walk by faith is an everyday experience.

Note **Genesis 12:9-13** 



At the first <u>obstacle</u>, Abram turned his back on God's promises (land and children) and God Himself (note **Genesis 12:14-16**).

God's promise, if left just to Abram, is in <u>jeopardy</u>. Note **Genesis 12:17** 

God would have to use plagues to restore Sarai to her destiny and <u>deportation</u> to get Abram back to Canaan. (Kidner)

#### Note Genesis 16:1-5, 18:9-15, 20:1b-3

So important = Abraham didn't earn friendship with God because of his <u>performance</u>.

It was simply a gift of God's grace.

God's friends do believe and have faith.

But they're not  $\underline{\text{perfect}}$  and they can still struggle with doubts.

They're totally dependent on God's grace.

#### Note Genesis 18:17

Abraham becomes a person, that despite his doubts, not only trusts God, but also become a person God can <u>trust</u> (note **John 15:14-15**).

#### So can there be benefit to my doubt?

- Isn't it encouraging to <u>learn</u> that the Captain of the Faith Hall of Fame, Abraham, struggled at times with doubts, fears, and failures?
- What Abraham learned is that doubt doesn't <u>work out</u> well.
- Faith always leads to a <u>best</u> outcome (note **Genesis 15:6**).
- You can be God's friend because God's <u>incredible</u> grace is more than sufficient to turn your heart towards Him, forgive your sins, and help you discover that faith is always the better choice than doubt.
