1. As a group, explore what you have been processing from reading Chapter 2 of *The Benefit of Doubt*.
2. Read **2 Chronicles 20:7**, **James 2:23**, **Genesis 12:9-17**. Abraham was called a “friend of God,” even though he still had doubts about trusting God with the details of his life. How do you respond to knowing your doubts don’t disqualify you from friendship with God?
3. Three times the Scriptures show Abraham trying to manipulate the situation by being clever rather than by trusting God at His word (**Genesis 12:11-17**; **16:1-5**; **20:1b-3**). Share a time when your doubts caused you to depend on your cleverness rather than God. How did that work out?
4. Pastor Tom stated, “Abraham didn’t earn friendship with God...It was simply a gift of God’s grace.” Where do you need to stop trying to earn God’s friendship and just accept His grace?
5. How does God’s trust in Abraham, even knowing all of his shortcomings past, present and future, encourage you to trust God with your life despite your own shortcomings? (**Genesis 18:17**; **John 15:14-15**)
6. By grace, Jesus desires and invites you to be His friend. What doubts are keeping you from saying “YES!” to Jesus today?

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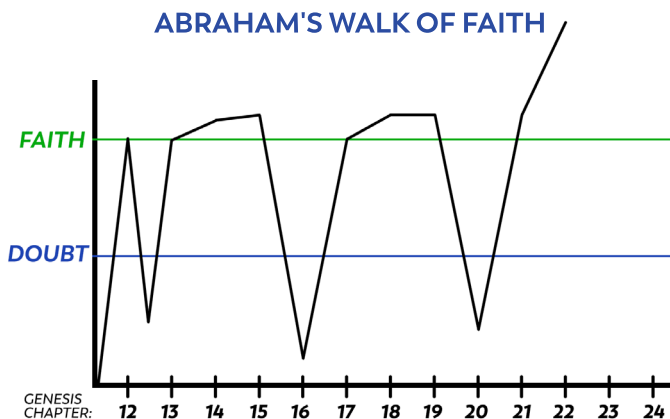
