
If you could be someone else for a day, who would it be?

- **3.** Read Mark 6:4 and Matthew 13:55-56. How could familiarity with someone's life cause us to miss the truth about them, even though we think we know them well?
- **4.** Why do you think it can be hard for people to see Jesus for who He really is? (**2 Corinthians 4:4**) How easy (or hard) is it for people to see Jesus in you?
- **5.** If you follow Jesus, describe the moment He "made His light shine" in your heart resulting in your miraculous 'YES!'. What about Jesus led you to make Him the Lord of your life? (**2 Corinthians 4:6**)
- **6.** Overcoming your doubts is a *lifelong* walk with Jesus that begins by saying 'YES!' to him. Have you said your 'YES!'?

The Benefit of Doubt
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Our focus these weeks has been on different people in the Scriptures who struggled with <u>doubt</u>.

But God actually used their doubts to ultimately deepen their faith and not have doubt be what defines them.

It's <u>amazing</u> to think that some of the people who knew Jesus the longest and the best struggled with doubts about who He was and what His mission was (note <u>Mark 6:4</u>).

#### 1. The Roots of These Doubts (note Matthew 13:55-56; John 7:5)

- A. It's easier to be skeptical of siblings (note Luke 2:41ff).
- **B.** It had to be difficult to have Jesus for a <u>brother</u> think of it...a sibling with spiritually defective DNA, but with some good <u>gifts</u> and abilities can be a tough act to follow; but Jesus was a perfect, incredibly gifted older sibling who had extraordinary <u>moral</u> character. He would have been a <u>mirror</u> to His siblings, reflecting to them what they were not and highlighting their wrong thoughts/motives/actions that He never had.
- Concerned for His welfare (note Mark 3:20-21, 31) mixture of concern but also disagreement with His ministry/message...as Jesus' family/friends saw the growing opposition to His ministry by the religious and political powers of the day (note Mark 3:20-21), they were perplexed why Jesus seemed unaware that He was poking the bear...
- They didn't comprehend His <u>mission</u> while Jesus' family was familiar with Him as a Person, their understanding of a warrior King <u>Messiah</u> didn't seem to describe Jesus. Note <u>John 7:3-5</u> (they sound like <u>political</u> consultants wanting power...).

### 2. So, What Shattered Their Doubts and Created Faith?

Note Acts 1:14; 15:13-14, 19; 1 Corinthians 15:7
This is the <u>power</u> of the gospel (note 1 Corinthians 15:3-8; Romans 1:16).
Note Jude 1a, 4b, 24-25; James 1:1a; 2:1

The Lord of glory had once slept beside them, ate at their dinner table, played with their friends, spoke to them like brothers, <u>endured</u> their unbelief, paid the debt of their sin, and then brought them to faith. (Bloom)

#### So can there be benefit to my doubt?

- There was no better witness/example of the Christian faith than Jesus.
- But even His own brothers doubted Him for <u>20-30</u> years...
- Note 2 Corinthians 4:4, 6
- It took 20-30 years of Jesus' faithful witness to His brothers, but the greatest miracle God ever does happened.
- Let God do His greatest miracle in your life today.
