A Note from Grant Fishbook LEAD TEACHING PASTOR



Looking back over my 24 years at CTK, one of the most poignant spiritual moments I recall happened through a piece of furniture. One Easter season,

Mike Kemp (Pastor Melonie's husband) crafted a huge cross that was laid flat and elevated about three feet off the ground. That cross became our Communion table during the Easter season. Covered in bread and communion cups, the Cross became the table that reminded us of all that Jesus had done to make a way for us to sit at his table.

One evening during our Easter week experience, I made my way into the Worship Center and positioned myself near this cross table. I remember watching one man slowly approach it, take the elements of Communion with trembling hands, and then fall to his knees in repentance and gratitude. As he ate the bread and drank the cup, I couldn't help but think how overjoyed Jesus must have been because this precious family member came and ate at his table. I stood for what must have been a solid hour and watched a similar scene happen over and over again, as

many more people came to connect, be blessed, embrace brokenness, and be given grace. What a moment!

This fall at CTK is all about *tables* and *crosses*. Along with a few others, I'll be preaching about how Jesus expanded a table to include the most unlikely of guests. In fact, he became known as a "friend of sinners." This open table caused quite a stir with the religious elite, but Jesus just kept bringing and including. And the Kingdom kept growing and expanding. We are going to follow the example of Jesus and accept the challenge to welcome more and more people, some like us and many not like us, to sit and enjoy the presence of the King.

Following "The Table" series, we'll move to the focal point of every dinner conversation Jesus ever started—the Cross. I am excited to walk through "A Cross-Centered Life" as we contemplate how our world has centered itself of so many things other than the Cross—money, self, sex, opinion, or the future. And as Jesus followers, we'll have to ask ourselves if our focus is any different. It's going to be an exciting ride and I can't wait to see what God does through tables and crosses this fall.

Growing up, we had a large extended family on both my mom’s and my dad’s sides. Family gatherings were always loud and a bit chaotic

with good food and connection, and usually a trip to the neighborhood park a block away afterward. There was always a “big” table and a “kids” table no matter whose house we gathered at. I can’t remember how old I was when I graduated to the “big” table. I was the oldest grandkid so I was the first to move up. I *loved* sitting at the big table.

I now have adult children and grandchildren of my own. As in my childhood, we gather a lot as a family. But one distinct difference is that there is no kids’ table. My daughter insisted that her daughter be included at the table and in the conversation as soon as she could move from a high chair to a booster seat. My table is long now (with two extensions) and a bit crowded with three grandchildren, but everyone has a seat at the table.

I love this difference—intentionally erasing lines that sort and separate us. There are so many ways we partition ourselves from other humans. But what if we engaged our world the way my daughter has chosen to engage her child? What if, instead of sorting and separating, we invited and included people who are both similar to and different from us, whether in age, gender, ethnicity, economics, education, hobbies or preferences. Those who think and believe like us and those who don’t.

My challenge to you this season is to extend your table, invite and include someone(s) who you would normally—maybe unintentionally—sort out and separate from. Jesus intentionally modeled this. He was a master at inviting very different people to have a seat at his table, together.

I pray the Lord blesses you with many opportunities for a crowded table, using both extensions!






Days for Girls is an international non-profit that helps girls gain access to quality sustainable feminine hygiene and awareness by directly distributing sustainable feminine hygiene kits.





Since opening their Bellingham office in September 2021, **World Relief of Western Washington** has resettled nearly 100 refugees fleeing violence and persecution and assisted around 400 Ukrainians who’ve found refuge with friends or family in Whatcom & Skagit counties. The first wave came as US supporters were pulled out of Afghanistan as the capital city of Kabul fell. The next wave came as Ukraine was torn apart by war. And all the while, a brand-new team, backed by years of experience at the King County office, rallied our community to welcome families who have survived so much.

We are proud to host their English as a Second Language class here at CTK every Monday through Thursday. It’s just one of the pieces to rebuilding a life in a new place. We also just hosted their walk-through experience, From Home to Home, in hopes that awareness and compassion would spread in Bellingham and beyond as people get a small taste of the journey refugees must walk.




You can help meet the growing need by regularly donating to our Food Share ministry
