#### FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK . . .



(Mark 1:17)

Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

The theme scripture is nestled in the passage of Mark, chapter 1 verses 16-20 where Jesus calls His first disciples. Jesus was passing alongside the Sea of Galilee and saw two fishermen, Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net from their boat into the sea. Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men". Verse 18 says, "And immediately they left their nets and followed Him".

Going a little farther, Jesus saw two more fishermen, James the son of Zebedee and his brother John who were in a boat repairing their nets. Jesus immediately called them; and James and John left their father in the boat along with hired servants and went after Jesus.

How does the theme scripture and this passage of scripture apply to believers in Jesus Christ today? I'm glad that you asked. Using a fishing metaphor, these first disciples whose original mission was to spread their nets to catch fish, lives were transformed and they now had a new mission to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to catch people. Like these first disciples, we were transformed as a new creature and have the same mission to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to catch people.

One thing that's for certain, fish will never be caught unless a net is casted. Likewise, people will never be caught to receive salvation unless the gospel of Jesus Christ is shared. Fishers will tell you that fishing is hard work and requires patience. So, don't get discouraged and give up when you don't immediately have a catch. Share the Gospel of Jesus Christ again and again. Eventually someone will come to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and your fishing will not have been in vain. "For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name" (Hebrews 6:10a).

## "It's Fishing Time: Have You Prepared Your Nets?"

"Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men."
(Mark 1:17) (EVS)

In a single moment, everything changed for the four fishermen Jesus called by the Sea of Galilee. They had no idea that their simple "yes" would launch them into a journey that would reshape history. Ordinary men became foundational voices in the spreading of the Gospel, empowered by Christ to partner in God's redemptive work—casting spiritual nets to gather souls into the Kingdom.

We, too, can remember the moment when the Good News was shared with us—when a "fisher of men or women" crossed our path, and something in us shifted. That divine encounter became the beginning of a new purpose: to be used by God to lead others to Jesus.

Yet, like the first disciples, we don't always get it right.

In Mark's Gospel, the disciples are portrayed not as spiritual heroes, but as deeply human—often confused, afraid, and slow to understand. They struggled to grasp Jesus' mission, especially His path to the cross. Their hearts were hardened. They misunderstood His parables. They couldn't heal when given authority. They rebuked children whom Jesus welcomed. They fell asleep instead of praying. They vowed to die for Him—yet scattered when the time came. One betrayed Him. Another denied Him three times.

Still, Jesus looked past their failures—and He looks past ours too.

He didn't give up on them, and He hasn't given up on us. Instead, He equips us. He restores us. He teaches us how to mend our nets.

So, the question remains: Have you prepared your net?

In this season, we are again being called to fish—to reach the lost, the hurting, the searching. But our nets must be ready. They must be strong woven with faith, obedience, resilience, and grace. Our nets must be crafted by Jesus himself through prayer, study, worship, and community.

We are not perfect, but we are chosen. We are not always prepared, but we are called. And the good news is Jesus still makes fishers of people out of imperfect vessels like you and me.

It's fishing time.

Are your nets ready?














## "It's Fishing Time"

As Christians we are called to tell the good news and the story of Jesus Christ and tell everyone of His mercy and goodness. We are to go out and win souls for Christ. Being "Fishers of Men" is a metaphor for evangelism and spreading the good news about Jesus Christ. Every time we take advantage of an opportunity to witness to someone, they may not accept Jesus Christ. Remember whenever we do witness we are planting a seed. We must remain persistent and patient. Like fishing we don't stop if we don't catch a fish, being fishers of men, we don't stop if someone doesn't accept salvation initially.


# Luke 10:2 (NKJV) The harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.
