

## Kenya Missions Update



**FALL 2025** 

So far, 2025 has been a fruitful year in the ministries of VOGM. We have seen tremendous growth both numerically and


spiritually. Our church in Ithanga has increased in average attendance to 400 people for Sunday morning worship service. Pastor John Mutuku reported that many church members had returned back to the church after leadership visited them and held prayer meetings in their homes for a period of five months showing them love and care.

Sunday schools started in Sagana church where there were previously none at all. New people (parents of the kids in the Sunday School classes) have visited the churches and committed their lives to Christ. The parents visited because they experienced the changes in behavior of their children who were attending the new Sunday school classes. This has led to more than 30 water baptisms at these churches. There are more people waiting to be baptized and have requested to be taught the basics of Christian faith.

VOGM pastors have been praying that one day the Lord would bless them with at least one church building which is owned by the VOGM. Most of our church structures are rented. This has sometimes brought sadness when buildings are taken over by rich businessmen because they can pay much more money to the owners to establish other businesses. We are changing this approach to renting buildings for worship to that of land lease. We rent a plot of land for one year to

build a chapel using old

iron sheets. We have managed to rent and build two plots so far. The weather has been favorable and as such we have had good harvest last season meaning we didn't need much relief support as in the past when rain



There are tentative plans for the women in our churches to form an association through which they could gather and help each other both spiritually and socially. They anticipate they will have laid down objectives to guide them before the end of the year. The VOGM is ready to support such a venture which can be a strong milestone in our ministry. As usual, we thank those who continue to pray and give to VOGM through Global Reach. Those funds are used for various ministry needs including scholarships for needy children, pastoral training, and preaching of the gospel. May the Lord richly bless you all. Amen.
