My name is Stanley Lambert, and I am a married father of three. I am honored and grateful to serve as the Project Help Haiti Mission Coordinator for Global Reach, a responsibility I view as a sacred trust from God.

My passion for mission work began after the devastating 2010 Haiti Earthquake. I witnessed unspeakable suffering—thousands of lives lost and countless people in desperate need of shelter, food, and hope. It was in that moment of national pain that God called me to serve.

I had the privilege of serving as Director of Waters of Grace for eight years, a mission that transformed lives both physically and spiritually. In 2021, I graduated from Project Help's Physical Therapy School which Jean Weaver has started and oversees it building upon my earlier studies in Business Administration. I later served as Hospital Administrator for PHH in Pierre Payen, where I had the joy of forging lasting relationships with pastors, school leaders, and mission staff.

As Mission Coordinator, I now work closely with Global Reach Director Travis and Pastor Denis, the PHH liaison, to lead three core ministry areas:

1. Medical Services
2. Community Development and Church Growth
3. Educational Advancement

Last Sunday night, the locality of Petit-Rivière faced a harrowing gang attack that severely impacted one of our sister churches and schools. The violence forced the

evacuation of many residents, with at least a hundred seeking refuge at our campus in Borel. These individuals arrived with nothing but the clothes on their backs, lacking essential items such as food, clothing, and basic necessities. We urge everyone to join us in prayer for those affected by this tragic event. The political and economic crisis in Haiti remains unresolved, though there are signs of slight improvement. Your prayers and support are crucial as we navigate these challenging times. Despite the turmoil, we are grateful that our churches and schools have remained largely unaffected by the gang violence, which is predominantly concentrated in Port-au-Prince, the capital. This blessing allows us to continue our mission of building more schools and churches, equipping our pastors and leaders to minister effectively. Our focus on educational advancement drives us to provide more educational materials and initiate teacher development programs. We are committed to creating more opportunities for children, ensuring they have access to quality education and a brighter future.

Worsening Conditions on Île de la Gonâve

The people on Île de la Gonâve are facing severe food insecurity. Their dependence on mainland transport from Port-au-Prince has been cut off due to gang activity, leaving many without access to food, water, and essential supplies.

- Pray for safe transport channels to open for humanitarian aid to reach the island.
- Pray for wisdom and capacity as we prepare to assist in feeding and supporting those who are suffering.
- Pray for endurance and peace for the isolated communities on the island.



3. Praise Report: Peace Restored Between Carpiatre, Deluge, and Montrouis

We thank God for a peace agreement reached three weeks ago between the communities of Carpiatre, Deluge, and Montrouis after a prolonged and deadly conflict over ancestral land claims.

- Praise God for reconciliation and a unified decision to end violence.
- Pray for ongoing peace, trust-building, and restoration of relationships.
- Pray for the hospital in the area, which is now resuming operations after being paralyzed by the conflict.
- Pray for safe transportation and stability, which are improving as peace is maintained.

4. Summer Break & Ongoing Education

As most schools across the country prepare to close for summer break next month, we pray for:

- Rest and restoration for students and teachers.
- Safe and enriching environments during the school break, especially in high-risk areas.
- Continued access to food and care, especially for children who depend on school-based meals and support.

5. General Prayer Needs

- Medical Ministry: Pray for strength and resources for clinics and care teams.
- Churches, schools and Mission Teams leaders: Pray for courage, unity, and clarity in ministry efforts.
- National Peace and Stability: Pray for the Lord's protection over the nation, and for justice, reconciliation, and healing where violence has broken communities.
- Prayer for myself and my family here, and my family in Haiti.
